1	[Condemning the Immigration and Customs Enforcement Agency (ICE) and Urging Strict Adherence to Due Process, Family Unity, and Humane Treatment of Migrants]
2	Adherence to Bue 1 100000, 1 anily officy, and Flamane Treatment of Migrante
3	Resolution condemning the abduction of immigrants by the Immigration and Customs
4	Enforcement Agency (ICE) and urging strict adherence to due process, family unity,
5	and humane treatment of migrants who safely and lawfully pursue their claims.

7	WHEREAS, The United States was founded on principles of civil rights and due
8	process for all, as a beacon of hope for immigrants seeking refuge and opportunity; and
9	WHEREAS, Numerous instances of inhumane abduction of immigrants, at a mass
10	scale and in a widespread indiscriminate manner, including those who are diligently
11	cooperating with law enforcement, have been documented by legal aid and civil rights
12	organizations; and
13	WHEREAS, There are reports of Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) agency
14	abducting individuals without clear explanation of charges, detaining individuals without
15	immediate access to legal counsel or family notification, using excessive force or intimidation
16	during arrests, including among detainees with no criminal records or charges; blurring the
17	lines between legitimate law enforcement and arbitrary detention; and
18	WHEREAS, These practices disproportionately affect vulnerable populations, including
19	asylum seekers, refugees, and undocumented individuals who are seeking safety and a better
20	life; and
21	WHEREAS, According to Transaction Records Access Clearinghouse, a significant
22	number of people held in ICE detention have no criminal record, signifying that ICE is
23	arresting individuals solely for being in the United States without legal status, even if they
24	have no criminal history; and

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1	WHEREAS, These activities have resulted in the separation of families, leaving
2	children without parents, and spouses without partners, leading to severe psychological
3	trauma, undermining public trust in law enforcement, and violating fundamental civil rights,
4	including the right to due process, and the human right to family unity; and
5	WHEREAS, The San Francisco area office of ICE has the highest number of enrollees
6	in Alternatives to Detention (ATD) monitoring programs that operate on the principle of
7	releasing migrants who are deemed not to be threats to public safety; however ICE has
8	reversed this practice by accelerating detentions of these immigrants when they arrive at pre-
9	scheduled check-in meetings at ICE offices; and
10	WHEREAS, The change of practice in the ATD Program calls into question the fairness
11	and prioritization of ICE's enforcement practices, as well as the potential impact on families
12	and communities who are effectively discouraged from safely and lawfully pursuing their
13	immigration claims; now, therefore, be it
14	RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco hereby unequivocally
15	condemns the abduction of immigrants by the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE)
16	agency and calls for an immediate cessation of such practices; and, be it
17	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco urges ICE to
18	ensure strict adherence to due process, family unity, and humane treatment of migrant
19	communities who safely and lawfully pursue their claims; and, be it
20	FURTHER RESOLVED, That while the Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE)
21	agency is tasked with enforcing immigration laws, its methods should align with human rights,
22	civil liberties, and the values of a just society; and, be it
23	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors calls upon
24	elected officials at all levels of government to advocate for and implement policies that uphold

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1	the rights and dignity of all immigrants and to use all lawful means to hold federal agencies
2	accountable for their actions.
