Resolution commending the Coalition on Homelessness for their tireless work on organizing and advocating with the homeless community in San Francisco.

WHEREAS, the Coalition on Homelessness, San Francisco (COH) was organized in 1987 to garner the active participation of poor people on both/the design and critique of public policy and non-profit services that result in permanent solutions to poverty.

WHEREAS, COH is a unique organization made up of low income and homeless people, working in every aspect of the organization, from the volunteers to the staff and leadership body.

WHEREAS, COH works to alleviate poverty by taking a multi-faceted strategy, attacking the forces that cause poverty from all sides. This strategy makes sure homeless and poor people know their rights in participating in the shaping and formulating of public policy.

WHEREAS, COH's Civil Rights Legal Division links organizing and outreach activities with appropriate legal responses to homelessness. This fights inequities through participatory legal actions, while at the same time creating a pro-active agenda to end civil rights abuses of homeless people in San Francisco.

WHEREAS, COH's Family Rights and Dignity Project seeks to reshape institutions and policies relevant to poor families by creating a political alliance of homeless and low income parents; opening channels of access to elected officials and policy makers, demanding representation on policy-making entities, and conducting public education campaigns to develop an understanding of the underlying causes of poverty and homelessness.

WHEREAS, COH's Housing Not Borders focuses on undocumented homeless immigrants who are increasingly facing growing hostilities, denial of services and San Francisco Police Department arbitrary arrests and round-ups of unemployed laborers. Housing Not Borders operates as a "support system", providing a culturally and secure atmosphere to organize, educate and mobilize homeless Latinos and residents of the Mission District to promote social and economic justice.

WHEREAS, COH's Shelter Outreach Project visits shelters serving homeless individuals and families three times weekly to provide information on pertinent COH activities and available resources. Shelter visits generate feedback from homeless people regarding shelter conditions and effectiveness of services. This information guides the Coalition to ensure

1	development of programs, services and policies which truly serve the people they are designed to serve.		
2	WUEDEAS COU's Substance Abuse Montal Health Work Crown (SAMH) addresses the		
3	WHEREAS, COH's Substance Abuse Mental Health Work Group (SAMH) addresses the quality and inadequate supply of substance abuse and mental health services in San		
4	Francisco. The goal of SAMH is to preserve and improve existing treatment services, as well as to expand these desperately needed services city wide.		
5	WHEREAS, the Coalition publishes the Street Sheet, a monthly newspaper written primarily		
6	by homeless and formerly homeless people, which is sold by homeless vendors in San		
7	Francisco for \$1. In addition, the Street Sheet provides a perspective on homelessness through its editorial policy and artwork that is not available in the mainstream media.		
8	WHEREAS, the Coalition believes that homelessness cannot be alleviated without intensive		
9	outreach, support, training, and organizing in order for homeless people to participate		
10	planning and advocacy efforts and in the formation of government and social practices, programs, and policies.

12	BE IT RESOLVED, that the San Francisco Board of Supervisors commend the Coaliti Homelessness for their comprehensive work providing much needed services and programment.
