

1 [Accepting Report of San Francisco's First Pedestrian Safety Summit]
2 ACCEPTING THE REPORT FROM SAN FRANCISCO'S FIRST-EVER PEDESTRIAN
3 SAFETY SUMMIT.

4 WHEREAS, On May 26, 2000, San Francisco hosted its first-ever
5 Pedestrian Safety Summit at the Hiram Johnson State Office Building
6 Auditorium located at 455 Golden Gate Avenue; and,

7 WHEREAS, The Pedestrian Safety Summit was convened by Supervisor
8 Mabel Teng with the co-sponsorship of Assembly Majority Leader Kevin
9 Shelley and Mayor Willie L. Brown, Jr. with the support of the full
10 Board of Supervisors and the participation of the San Francisco
11 Police Department, the Department of Parking and Traffic, the
12 Department of Public Health, MUNI, the District Attorney's Office,
13 Caltrans, and the Transportation Authority; and,

14 WHEREAS, The Pedestrian Safety Summit brought together these
15 City officials and staff with advocates representing BayPeds, Walk
16 SF, Senior Action Network, the San Francisco Bicycle Coalition, the
17 Pedestrian Safety Task Force, and the San Francisco Parent Teacher
18 Association, as well as neighborhood activists, residents, and the
19 entire San Francisco community to begin developing a comprehensive
20 plan of action for pedestrian safety; and,

21 WHEREAS, More than 200 people attended the Pedestrian Safety
22 Summit, discussing topics that included the City's progress in
23 retiming the lights to allow pedestrians more time to cross the
24 street safely, an inventory of the number of signalized intersections
25 still lacking pedestrian signals, pilot projects focusing on

1 pedestrian safety measures - such as the "pedestrian scramble"
2 signals, educational outreach, and enforcement of pedestrian safety
3 violations; and,

4 WHEREAS, These attendees generated 105 ideas to make San
5 Francisco a more liveable, more walkable, and more pedestrian-
6 friendly City; and

7 WHEREAS, These ideas have been compiled in San Francisco's First
8 Pedestrian Safety Summit report; now therefore be it,

9 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County
10 of San Francisco hereby accepts the report from San Francisco's
11 first-ever Pedestrian Safety Summit.
