23	(i)	<u>Staff</u>	Support. The Police Department shall provide staff support and
24	resources fo	or the C	Committee. The Board of Supervisors Office of the Legislative Analyst shall
25	provide rese	earch a	ssistance as requested by the Committee.

1	(j) <u>Meetings.</u> The Committee shall meet at least quarterly. All meetings, except as
2	provided by applicable laws, shall be open to the public.
3	(k) Establishment of Rules and Regulations. The Committee, which qualifies as
4	a Policy Body under San Francisco Administrative Code Chapter 67 (the "Sunshine
5	Ordinance"), shall establish rules and regulations for its own organization and procedure that
6	are consistent with the Sunshine Ordinance and other laws governing the conduct of public
7	meetings.
8	(I) Sunset Clause. The provisions of this ordinance and the operation of the
9	Committee shall expire four years from the date of passage of this Ordinance by the Board of
10	Supervisors, unless otherwise extended by resolution.
