Refuse Services Contract: Brief History

- Since 2004, City has held consolidated contract for refuse collection with services for City government facilities through the Office of Contract Administration
- Sole source contract approved in 2014 for 6 years, NTE \$48M
- November 2020 : new contract was before the Board but no action taken
 - For continuity of refuse service, OCA entered into an interim contract covering Dec 2020 – Nov 2021
 - Original NTE: \$5.6M
 - Amended NTE: \$9.9M
 - Duration : December 1, 2020 November 30, 2021
 - Board approved contract extension in Nov. 2021
 - **NTE**: \$15.6M
 - Duration: December 1, 2020 June 30, 2022
 - o Board approved contract extension in June 2022 allows time to solicit for new services
 - Current NTE: \$39.6M
 - Current Duration: December 1, 2020 June 30, 2024
 - OCA amended June 2023 to adjust rates, as authorized by Board in June 2022

New Refuse Services Solicitation Timeline

- June 2022: Issued solicitation for new City refuses services
- January 11, 2023: Evaluation complete, issue Conditional Notice of Intent to Award to Allied Waste Services
- February 2023: CEQA process kicks off
- November 2023: Allied submitted application to DPH for refuse collection truck permit
- February 2024: Planning completes CEQA process
 - Addendum
- February 2024 : BOS Approval Process
- March 2024: Execute contract and finalize DPH permits
- April June 2024: Transition 375+ City sites to new services
- June 30, 2024: Recology's contract for City refuse services ends

Proposed Contract: Overview of Major Provisions

- <u>Duration</u>: 7 years + option to extend up to 10 years
- NTE: \$119,000,000 (total for 7-year initial duration +3-year extension)
 - Based on representative month of utilization
 - Includes 15% contingency

• Scope:

- Refuse collection service for all City departments comprising 380+ locations
- Ancillary service (collection of bulky item, pallets, etc.) & lease and purchase of compactors

Rates:

- <u>Uniform Collection Rates</u>: same rates applied for trash, recyclables, compost based on frequency of service, weekday vs. weekend
- Volumetric "Recovery" Discount: applied to total monthly bill based on % of collected recyclable and compostable material vs. total collected
- Ancillary Charges & Equipment: for bulky item pickup, overages, equipment leases, etc.
- <u>Contamination Charges</u>: for repeated mixing of materials in specified bins (e.g. recyclables in trash bin)
- Price Adjustments: annual rate adjustment based on % change in CPI

Performance Measures

- Response time to service issues and complaints by City: % of "First call resolution"
- Service Levels:
 - Number / % of missed collections
 - Response to on-call, emergency, and holiday service requests
- Compliance with:
 - Audit, inspection, and route review requirements per Env. Code Ch. 19 and SB 1383
 - General reporting requirements
- **Billing:** Number / % of billing errors; timely resolution of billing errors

Zero Waste:

Citywide goals

- Reduce generation by 15% by 2030 and
- Reduce disposal to landfill by 50% by 2030

City Government ZW Goals

- Improve of existing zero waste programs at City Departments
- Increase city agency recovery by 5% in the first year of the contract
