The Mission is an area of high graffiti reports. I've taken an interest in graffiti for over ten years and lived in the Mission over twenty. I bring to the Board some of the long term resident community perspectives on what works and doesn't. I've attended the GAB (Graffiti Advisory Board) meetings for four years, and I am the at large representative (seat 18) since seats were reconfigured two years ago. I have good attendance at the meeting, co-chaired the Abatement Subcommittee. A unique contribution is I am known for bringing rigorous data and mapped location analysis - available from <https://datasf.org/opendata/> - to the discussion.

My participation at GAB enhances the discussion by grounding it to verifiable data and location analysis as well as the possibility that the SF311 app has created. My views as a long term resident in an area of high graffiti also further broadens the discussion.

Business and/or professional experience:

The ability of the City to quickly remediate graffiti has changed in the last years. Civic engagement in graffiti fighting has soared with yearly reports of graffiti going from 20K to 80K, this is not because graffiti 4Xed, but because the ubiquity of mobile devices capable of running the SF311 app and its second order effects. Residents reported more graffiti because it was much easier to do so, and because of heightened expectation that the graffiti would actually be cleaned.

SF311 app reports cost less and are better than voice line calls of graffiti. SF311 app reports contains GPS coordinates, photographs, timestamps and reference numbers - so it's easier for the DPW and departments to quickly get trucks and find the graffiti. It also became unacceptably dangerous for city employees to falsely claim the graffiti was already cleaned- when easily shared photos could show otherwise. With before and after pictures verification it is now easy for managers to check on employees, and residents to check on departments.

The rising expectation that the City could quickly clean reported graffiti fit is confirmed with the rising expectations of very fast location based services in the private sector such as amazon package delivery, Uber and Lyft car service. Technology has opened new community centric ways to address graffiti, I try to be a thoughtful and informed voice in nudging things within those possibilities.

As a Hispanic single mother of 2 young daughters and voting resident of the City and County of San Francisco, my qualifications pursuant to this respective board are that as a citizen and resident of this city who wants to ensure our neighborhoods are free and clear of graffiti which greatly impacts our communities and has the potential to attract more crime and other issues if not abated. We must be accountable for providing our children and residents clean and safe streets and not contribute to the overall "broken-windows theory" which impact our neighborhoods as a whole. Unabated graffiti is a direct example of this theory. Working in District 3 and residing in District 4, it is evident that graffiti crime is not specific to anyone neighborhood and reflective of our overall need to hold building owners and merchants accountable and provide them with information on effective graffiti reporting procedures so that we may combat this issue and educate our community on the importance of being proactive.

Business and/or professional experience:

As a former law enforcement officer, I have first-hand experience with this type of crime and have seen the direct impact on how unabated graffiti in low-income neighborhoods can be a direct contributor to the overall crime rate of that area. As a real estate broker, I am urban land use focused and work heavily in the neighborhoods in which I represent building owners in that I am proactive when it comes to graffiti on any of the properties I represent by addressing it immediately with the building owner to ensure it is abated in a short amount of time. Working in structural engineering and representing owners on a larger scale who are developing multifamily buildings, it is imperative now, more than ever, that as a city we get a handle on graffiti crime. Graffiti in San Francisco has gone beyond impacting low-income neighborhoods and is seen all over the city. I am also an advocate for neighborhood CBDs, which I believe once formed, are designed to maintain clean and safe streets all across San Francisco. I have been in the real estate industry for almost 18 years and began my career working for a firm that aids cities in the formation of PBIDs, BIDs and CBDs. I am politically active in the City of San Francisco and have established a reputation for being neighborhood-revitalization focused and have dedicated much time towards advocating for the formation and renewal of CBD's in San Francisco as well as creating a working relationship among building owners and merchants. 

Jessica Cabrera For Seat 7 – Graffiti Advisory Board –

Background and Qualifications:

I grew up in San Francisco in the Sunset District, where I reside now with my two young daughters. I attended Wallenberg High School class of 2001. Following that, I attended CSU, Sacramento and obtained my Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice in 2004. Post-graduation, I was a field intern for the Sacramento County Coroner's Office for 14 months. While working full-time as a Real Estate Property Manager, I sponsored myself in the POST Police Academy and attended the academy at night. I became a sworn Deputy Sheriff-Coroner with the Stanislaus County Sheriff's Department from 2007-2009. Unfortunately, I was laid off in 2009 due to the economic downturn. I relocated back to San Francisco in 2009 and returned my property management career. I obtained my real estate sales license in 2011 and then obtained an MBA in 2012.

I have worked independently as an agent and then independent real estate broker as of January 2016 with my own business still currently operating. My commercial real estate career in San Francisco has allowed me to advocate for value-added urban land use, advocacy for the formation of merchant's associations as well as the formation of CBDs within San Francisco. My efforts have been primarily focused in Lakeside Village, District 7, where I represent a family who owns multiple commercial buildings.

Board Qualifications:

The Graffiti Advisory Board consists of twenty-five (25) voting members who shall be appointed as follows:

- A) One (1) member shall be the Mayor or his/her designee;
- B) Eleven (11) persons appointed by individual members of the Board of Supervisors, to serve a term of two years, at the pleasure of the appointing Supervisor (these appointments shall be effective when written notice of the appointment is received by the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors); and
- C) The Board of Supervisors shall appoint the following members, who shall serve a term of two years:
 - > One (1) member representing youth groups who provide services for juveniles involved in alternative programs for graffiti diversion;
 - > One (1) employee, officer or member representing nonprofit organizations that provide services related to the City's beautification and neighborhood cleanup programs;
 - > Two (2) members representing businesses who operate in San Francisco, one of which must be a property owner where his/her business operates;
 - > One (1) employee or officer of a private school or art school who operate in San Francisco;
 - > One (1) employee or officer of the contracting agency for Municipal Railway shelters; and
 - > One (1) at-large member.
- D) The following officials and organizations shall each appoint one (1) member to serve on the Advisory Board:

- > The Director of Transportation of the Municipal Transportation Agency,
- > The Director of Public Works,
- > The General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department,
- > The District Attorney

If the Board of Education fails to appoint a member within 60 days of a vacancy, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint a student, teacher, or member of the San Francisco Unified School District academic branch.

Reports: (a) Prepare and submit a report to the Board of Supervisors and the Mayor every six months on graffiti, as it affects neighborhoods and the downtown area of San Francisco, which shall include a review and evaluation of the services and programs in place to respond to graffiti, prevention strategies, recommendations, and plans for a consolidated program of public and private efforts;

(b) Advise about the coordination of information, activities and goals among existing programs funded by the City and County and privately sponsored programs; and

(c) Advise about improving the efficiency in the provision of graffiti enforcement, prevention, and clean-up services.

Sunset Clause: The Advisory Board shall expire on March 11, 2019, unless the Board of Supervisors extends the term.


