

1 [Recreation and Park Department – Botanical Garden Non-Resident Fees.]

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3 **Ordinance amending the San Francisco Park Code, Article 12, by amending**
4 **Section 12.46, to establish admission fees to the Botanical Garden for non-San**
5 **Francisco residents, and making environmental findings.**

9 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

10 Section 1. Findings.

11 (a) The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this
12 Ordinance are in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public
13 Resources Code section 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the
14 Board of Supervisors in File No. _____ and is incorporated herein by reference.

15 (b) For fiscal year 2010-11, the Recreation and Park Department has had to reduce its
16 general fund support by 30%.

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18 Section 2. The San Francisco Park Code is hereby amended by amending Section
19 12.46, to read as follows:

20 **SEC. 12.46. COUNTY FAIR BUILDING AND BOTANICAL GARDEN ~~FACILITY RENTAL~~**
21 **FEES.**

22 (a) **Definitions.**

23 1. "Corporate Event" means any rental by, on behalf of, or in connection with any
24 corporate entity, except for Garden Clubs or Nonprofit Organizations as defined below.

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1 2. “Garden Club” means any garden club or flower society engaged in horticultural
 2 activities in which there are no monetary transactions (admission charge, donation, ticket
 3 sales, or product sales) during or in connection with the activity.

4 3. “Individual or Nonprofit Organization” means (a) any person renting the County Fair
 5 Building or Botanical Garden in his or her individual capacity for private use, or (b) any entity
 6 qualifying for tax-exempt status under 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3), engaged in community or social
 7 activities in which there are no monetary transactions (admission charge, donation, ticket sales, or
 8 product sales) during or in connection with the activity, or (c) any garden club or flower society
 9 using the County Fair Building or Botanical Garden for fundraising activities.

10 (b) **County Fair Building Facility Rental Fees.** All spaces must be rented for a
 11 minimum of two hours.

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7 If the Department receives revenue from a new tax that can be used for operating and
8 maintenance costs at the Botanical Gardens, authority to collect the non-resident fee for
9 entrance to the Gardens shall expire by operation of the law within 90 days after the effective
10 date of the new tax.

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12 The Department shall provide biannual reports to the Budget and Finance Committee on the
13 collection of the non-resident fee for entrance to the Botanical Gardens, such reports shall
14 include the following information: 1. Attendance figures for San Francisco residents,
15 Members of San Francisco Botanical Garden Society, and Non-San Francisco residents; 2.
16 Capital improvements and operating costs of the Botanical Gardens; 3. Capital improvements
17 and operating costs incurred by the Department and the Botanical Garden Society associated
18 with the collection of all fees, including a new resident fee; 4. Revenue from the new non-
19 resident fee, separated into (a) point of sale gate tickets and (b) actual attendance from
20 packaged sales with other Park sites, and revenue from all other fees; 5. The numbers of San
21 Francisco Botanical Garden Society members; and 6. Gifts, donations and services-in-kind
22 received by the Department and the Botanical Garden Society for the Botanical Garden.

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24 The non-resident fee for the Botanical Gardens shall sunset at the end of Fiscal Year 2010-
25 11.
