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RATIFYING EXCAVATION FUND EXPENDITURES MADE BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS PRIOR TO CLARIFYING ADDITIONS MADE IN 1998 TO THE ADMINISTRATIVE CODE.

WHEREAS, The Public Works Code has historically contained language relating to the Department of Public Work's ability to collect and utilize fees related to excavation permits; and,

WHEREAS, Prior to 1992, the Public Works Code, per Section 352, only allowed these fees to be used for costs related to inspections; and,

WHEREAS, In 1992, per Ordinance Number 213-92, Section 352 of the Public Works Code was amended to allow the Department to collect fees for excavation permits "to cover the cost incurred by the Department of Public Works in the exercise of its duties pursuant to this Article [Excavations in Streets] and for the administration, supervision and inspection of the permitted excavation"; and,

WHEREAS, The 1992 Public Works Code revisions did not amend Section 358 of the Code, which also contained pertinent language regarding the use of these monies; and,

WHEREAS, Section 358 of the Public Works Code stated that the monies paid to the Department of Public Works under the provision of Section 352 were to be deposited in a designated "Excavation Fund" that was "to be used to defray the cost of inspection made necessary by reason of such excavation and repairs"; and,

WHEREAS, The 1992 amendments of the Public Works Code thus left internally inconsistent sections in the Code in that that Section 352 allowed the Department of Public Works to collect monies to cover a wide range of costs related to the City's regulation of excavation while Section 358 only permitted the Department to spend the money "to defray the cost of inspection"; and,

WHEREAS, The Department of Public Works, relying on the provisions of Section 352, and unaware of the ambiguity created by Section 358, has consistently used monies in the Excavation Fund to pay costs for excavation-related regulatory activities that fall within the scope of Section 352, including, but not limited to, costs for computer equipment, programming, training, consultants, attorney services, public information, Police Department services, and inspector's cars; and

WHEREAS, Sections 352 and 358 of the Public Works Code were subsequently repealed in 1998 and replaced by Section 10.117-120 of the Administrative Code, which resolved this ambiguity and clearly reflects the Board of Supervisors' intent for the Department of Public Works to use monies in the Excavation Fund to pay for all costs associated with the City's regulation of excavation; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors finds that the Department of Public Works properly used monies in the Excavation Fund to cover the costs of excavation-related regulatory activities in reliance upon Section 352 of the Public Works Code, as amended in 1992; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors finds that the ambiguity described above that was created by Sections 352 and 358 was due to administrative oversight; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby ratifies the prior expenditures from the Excavation Fund by the Department of Public Works in reliance upon Public Works Code Section 352.
