LEGISLATION UNDER THE 30-DAY RULE

Rule 5.40 provides that when an ordinance or resolution is introduced which would CREATE OR REVISE MAJOR CITY POLICY, the committee to which the legislation is assigned shall not consider the legislation until at least thirty days after the date of introduction. The provisions of this rule shall not apply to the routine operations of the departments of the City or when a legal time limit controls the hearing timing. In general, the rule shall not apply to hearings to consider subject matter when no legislation has been presented, nor shall the rule apply to resolutions which simply URGE action to be taken.

Ordinance amending the San Francisco Police Code to add Article 42C, encompassing Sections 4200C.1 through 4200C.9, to require motor fuel refiners over a two year period to divest themselves of company operated service stations in the City and County of San Francisco and to preclude refiners from owning service stations in San Francisco in the future.

8. 071427 [Alternative Fuels Access Ordinance]

Ordinance amending the San Francisco Police Code to add Article 42E, encompassing Sections 4200E.1 through 4200E.5, to prohibit motor fuel refiners and distributors from limiting the ability of service station dealers having franchise or supply agreements to purchase motor fuel from any

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location or through any vendor in the refiner's wholesale network and to purchase alternative motor fuel from any source other than the refiner or distributor if the refiner or distributor is unable to provide the alternative motor fuel.
