3 **Resolution declaring October 18 –22, 2004 as “San Francisco – First in Solar Week” in**
4 **the City and County of San Francisco.**

6 WHEREAS, The San Francisco Public Utilities Commission (SFPUC) will host the
7 Solar Power 2004 conference and trade show which is the largest business-to-business and
8 business-to-consume solar event in the United States; and

9 WHEREAS, THE SFPUC and San Francisco’s Moscone Center recently received the
10 prestigious Green Power Leadership Award from the U.S. Department of Energy and the
11 Environmental Protection Agency, recognizing the City for the installation of a 675-kilowatt
12 solar power system at the Center; and

13 WHEREAS, The SFPUC will soon sign a contract to install a 225-kilowatt solar power
14 system at the Southeast Water Pollution Control Plant is planning the installation of the large-
15 scale power systems on municipal buildings; and

16 WHEREAS, The SFPUC is embarking on a program to install ten solar power systems
17 on neighborhood schools, libraries and clinics; and

18 WHEREAS, The SFPUC has reached an agreement with the Lennar Corporation to
19 provide solar power and energy efficiency measures in the 1600-home development that
20 Lennar will be constructing at the former Hunter’s Point Naval Shipyard; and

21 WHEREAS, The SFPUC and San Francisco’s Department of the Environment have
22 jointly organized and implemented a program to facilitate the installation of 100 solar power
23 systems on San Francisco residences and small businesses by the end of 2005; and

24 WHEREAS, The SFPUC and the San Francisco Unified School District have entered
25 into a historic “Solar Schools” agreement, a landmark renewable energy agreement for City
schools; and
