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AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE DEPARTMENT OF PARKING AND TRAFFIC TO RETROACTIVELY APPLY FOR, ACCEPT, AND EXPEND UP TO \$3.54 MILLION IN FEDERAL GRANTS FOR IMPLEMENTATION OF THE FIRST PHASE OF A STATE-OF-THE-ART INTEGRATED TRANSPORTATION MANAGEMENT SYSTEM (ITMS), FOREGOING REIMBURSEMENT OF INDIRECT COSTS.

WHERE AS. The Department of Parking and Traffic (DPT) has proposed to implement a San Francisco Integrated Transportation Management System (ITMS) that will utilize state-of-the-art technology to enhance traffic safety, improve transit operations, reduce congestion and travel time, improve responsiveness to special events and incidents, keep travelers informed of traffic conditions, and enhance communications coordination among DPT, Caltrans, MUNI, and other transit and transportation agencies, thereby improving the quality of life for all San Franciscans; and

WHEREAS, DPT will implement this \$43 million citywide system in multiple phases, area by area, as funding becomes available; the first phase of the system will focus on streets impacted by the Pacific Bell Park, the I-80 on- and off-ramp retrofit project. Moscone Convention Center expansion, and other developments in the South of Market area; portions of the first phase are targeted to be completed by April 2000, coinciding with the opening date of the Pacific Bell Park; and

WHEREAS. DPT has secured \$3.54 million of Federal grant funds, with \$2.0 million from the I-280 Interstate Transfer Concept Program (TCP), \$40,000 from the Surface Transportation Program (STP), and \$1.5 million from the Intelligent Gavin Newsom

Transportation System (ITS) Integration Program of Transportation Equity Act 21 (TEA 21), respectively, for implementation of the first phase of the ITMS system; and

WHEREAS, The first phase of ITMS will include a Transportation Management Center at DPT Traffic Engineering Office at 25 Van Ness Avenue, a satellite remote workstation at Pacific Bell Park, detectors and closed circuit television cameras for traffic volume and congestion monitoring, variable message signs for information dissemination, and upgrade traffic signal controllers for automated signal timing; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Executive Director of the Department of Parking and Traffic is authorized to retroactively apply for, accept, and expend \$3.54 million of Federal grants for implementation of the state-of-the-art integrated transportation management system (ITMS), foregoing reimbursement of indirect costs.
