5 year, despite explicit and protracted opposition from local community members; and

6           WHEREAS, Over 100 Americans were killed every day due to gun violence in 2017,  
7 and hundreds more were injured; and

8           WHEREAS, Children and teens in the United States are 17 times more likely to die  
9 from gun violence than their peers in other high-income countries; and

10          WHEREAS, If approved, California State Senate Bill No. 281 (SB 281) would put in  
11 place a statute governing the sale of guns and ammunition at the Cow Palace fairgrounds,  
12 gun shows would be categorically banned from the Cow Palace fairgrounds; and
