WHEREAS, the voters, by passing Proposition J in 1994, mandated to provide outreach advertising to those communities which may not be adequately served by the official newspaper (s), pursuant to Article IX, Section 2.80 and 2.80-1 of the San Francisco Administrative Code; and,

WHEREAS, in each year, the Board of Supervisors shall designate the outreach periodical for each outreach community, pursuant to Article IX, Section 2.81-3 of the San Francisco Administrative Code; and,

WHEREAS, by adopting Resolution No. 745-01 on October 1, 2001, the Board of Supervisors designated the periodicals to provide outreach advertising and mandated that expenditures for the outreach advertising program in Fiscal Year 2001-2002 shall not exceed \$100,000 without further Board approval; and,

WHEREAS, the \$100,000 approved by the Board of Supervisors will be exhausted the week of April 22, 2002 and additional funds in the amount of \$20,682 \$27,354 are needed to continue the outreach advertising program for the remainder of Fiscal Year 2001-2002; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Board of Supervisors hereby approves funds in the amount of \$20,682 \$27,354 to provide for outreach advertising expenditures in Fiscal Year 2001-2002.
