3	Resolution supporting student journalism; affirming the importance of free press; and
4	upholding free speech.
5	
6	WHEREAS, California adopted several laws, particularly in California Education Code,
7	Section 48907 to protect student journalists at all levels of education in public and private
8	schools and explicitly states that they cannot be censored or penalized; and
9	WHEREAS, In October 2024, The Lowell, a student publication at Lowell High School,
10	published an article titled "Invasive and Inappropriate" about incidents of alleged verbal
11	harassment and inappropriate behavior by teachers; and
12	WHEREAS, As described in The San Francisco Chronicle, the student editors felt
13	intimidated when Lowell High School administrators lectured them in a meeting and requested
14	advance review of future publications; and
15	WHEREAS, Student journalists at Lowell High School say they feel a chilling effect
16	after it was shared that the teacher who advises the student newspaper was assigned to a
17	
18	new role; and
19	WHEREAS, The student body at Lowell High School has been actively engaged on
20	issues regarding verbal harassment, sexual harassment and assault over the years; and
21	WHEREAS, Many San Francisco public high schools have student-run news sites,
22	provides a platform for expression, professional development for budding journalists,
23	engagement on news and topics, and a way to archive records; and

1	WHEREAS, Lincoln High School's student newspaper, <i>The Lincoln Log</i> , which
2	publishes stories that question school district policies as an example of how a robust student
3	publication can thrive under the First Amendment; and
4	WHEREAS, Lowell High School and Lincoln High School are the only two public high
5	school newspapers in San Francisco that publishes both a print and online edition; and we
6	must protect them and encourage more schools to have student publications; now, therefore,
7	be it
8	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
9	stands in support of student journalists, the right to free speech, and the importance of media
10	in elevating issues and exposing injustice; and, be it
11	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors encourages the San Francisco
12	Unified School District to uphold its commitment to students' right to free speech; and to
13	commit to training administrators and educators to ensure that student journalism is being
14	encouraged; and
15	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby directs the Clerk of the
16	Board to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the members of the San Francisco School
17	Board and Superintendent Maria Su.
