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8 WHEREAS, Refugees and immigrants comprise one in every three San Franciscans,

13 ordinance in the country prohibiting the use of local resources and personnel from assisting  
14 the federal government with targeting, arresting, and detaining immigrants for deportation  
15 unless required by state or federal law; and

16 WHEREAS, San Francisco's Sanctuary Ordinance has promoted public trust,  
17 cooperation, and public safety for all San Franciscans, by ensuring that all residents,  
18 regardless of immigration status, are comfortable calling the Police or Fire Department during  
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21 education by ensuring that all residents, regardless of immigration status, feel safe accessing  
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4 fearful to report crimes or obtain needed healthcare and make children afraid to go to school,
