EXTENDING INTERIM ZONING CONTROLS FOR AN ADDITIONAL SIX (6) MONTH PERIOD TO PROHIBIT TEMPORARILY THE INTRODUCTION OF NEW ESTABLISHMENTS OR EXPANSION OF EXISTING ESTABLISHMENTS SELLING ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES IN THE MID-MISSION ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGE SPECIAL USE

DISTRICT AND MAKING FINDINGS OF CONSISTENCY WITH THE PRIORITY POLICIES

WHEREAS, On June 18, 1997, the City and County of San Francisco enacted Resolution No. 592-97, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 111-97-3; and,

WHEREAS, This Resolution, adopted in accordance with the interim zoning control provisions of Section 306.7 of the City Planning Code, created an eighteen (18) month moratorium on the establishment of new enterprises or expansion of existing enterprises that sell alcoholic beverages in the Mid-Mission Alcoholic Beverage Special Use District: and

WHEREAS, Planning Code Section 306.7(i) requires that the Department of City Planning conduct a study of the contemplated zoning proposal and propose permanent legislation; and,

WHEREAS, The Planning Department is further required to report to the Board of Supervisors every six (6) months regarding the status of the planning study and findings and recommendations to date; and,

WHEREAS, There is continued concern about establishments that sell alcoholic beverages in the Mid-Mission Alcoholic Beverage Special Use District so that the existing moratorium should continue until permanent controls can be drafted, reviewed, and considered for adoption; and,

SUPERVISOR KATZ **BOARD OF SUPERVISORS**

WHEREAS, There is evidence that the ready availability of alcoholic beverages sold at off-sale liquor establishments and bars outside and contiguous with the moratorium area, Trumbull specifically on Mission Street between Randall and Turnbull-Streets, contributes to an inordinate amount of juvenile-related crime, and threatens the public health, welfare and safety by encouraging criminal behavior and other detrimental impacts on the neighborhood; and

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors has taken into account the time required to study a contemplated zoning proposal to address establishments that sell alcoholic beverages in and around the Mid-Mission Alcoholic Beverage Special Use District; and,

WHEREAS, On or about December 18, 1998, this temporary moratorium will expire; and,

WHEREAS, An interim extension measure is needed to bridge the gap between the initial moratorium and the development of permanent controls; and,

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors is authorized by Planning Code Section 306.7 to extend the duration of interim zoning controls for an additional six (6) months pending completion of further study of measures necessary to address enterprises that sell alcoholic beverages in and around the Mid-Mission Alcoholic Beverage Special Use District, which measures could then be incorporated into draft permanent legislation for review and action by appropriate City and County agencies, boards, commissions, and departments; and,

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors has balanced the hardship on business owners from extending the term of the interim controls against the detriment to the public if no extension were adopted; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors hereby extends the interim zoning control moratorium on new and existing establishments that sell alcoholic beverages in the Mid-Mission Alcoholic Beverage Special Use District, the terms of which are set forth in Board of

SUPERVISOR KATZ BOARD OF SUPERVISORS Supervisors Resolution No. 592-97, which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 111-97-3; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the interim controls shall remain in effect until June 18, 1999, or until the adoption of permanent legislation regulating enterprises that sell alcoholic beverages in the Mid-Mission Alcoholic Beverage Special Use District, whichever first occurs; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Department of City Planning shall undertake the study and make the reports required by Planning Code Section 306.7(i); and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That these interim controls advance and are consistent with the priority policies of Planning Code Section 101.1 in that they attempt to conserve existing housing and neighborhood character, preserve residential neighborhoods, conserve City commerce, and control uses that have an adverse impact on city services.
