[Urging United States and San Francisco Employers to Abide by the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and the Employee Free Choice Act: HR3619]

Resolution urging San Francisco employers to abide by the Universal Declaration of Human Rights and urging the 108<sup>th</sup> United States Congress to pass the Employee Free Choice Act.

WHEREAS, Every year since 1948 on December 10, tens of thousands of workers and allies mobilize to restore workers' freedom to join a union; and

WHEREAS, In 1948 the Universal Declaration of Human Rights was ratified by Eleanor Roosevelt and four fifths of the member countries of the United Nations; and

WHEREAS, Article 23 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights section 1 states: "Everyone has the right to work, to free choice of employment, to just and favorable conditions of work and to protection against unemployment"; and

WHEREAS, Article 23 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights section 2 states: "Everyone without any discrimination, has the right to equal pay for equal work"; and

WHEREAS, Article 23 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights section 3 states: "Everyone who works has the right to just and favorable remuneration ensuring for him/herself and his/her family an existence worthy of human dignity, and supplemented, if necessary, by other means of social protection"; and

WHEREAS, Article 23 of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights section 4 states: "Everyone has the right to form and to join trade unions for the protection of his/her interests"; and

WHEREAS, Everyday employers in the United States violate workers rights as described under the Universal Declaration of Human Rights; and

WHEREAS, United States laws have given workers the right to organize since 1935, however these federal laws have eroded over the years and are poorly enforced; and

WHEREAS, Even though United States laws guarantee workers' rights to choose for themselves whether or not to form a union, employers across the nation routinely violate that right; and

WHEREAS, Firing or discriminating against workers who try to form unions is illegal but commonplace in the United States; and

WHEREAS, Employers can legally force workers to attend closed-door meetings about the union on work time; and

WHEREAS, Workers are usually not free to attend their own meetings about forming a union on work time and must meet outside of work to discuss unionization; and

WHEREAS, Millions of workers in the United States, such as temporary or contractual workers, are not covered by laws that are supposed to protect the right to organize or bargain collectively; and

WHEREAS, Congressman George Miller (D-CA) and Senator Edward Kennedy (D-MA) have introduced the Employee Free Choice Act-legislation that will strengthen workers' rights in the United States; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby urges San Francisco employers to respect workers' rights under the Universal

Declaration of Human Rights and to respect worker's rights to organize independent of employer interference; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby urges the 108<sup>th</sup> United States Congress to pass the Employee Free Choice Act; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco will continue to work with the labor movement to ensure that all workers understand their rights to organize.
