

1 [Liquor License Transfer - 101-4th Street]

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3 **Resolution determining that the transfer of an existing Type 20 off-sale beer and**  
4 **wine license from 566 Minnesota Street to 101-4th Street (District 6), to Beth**  
5 **Aboulaforia for Target Corporation, dba City Target, will serve the public**  
6 **convenience or necessity of the people of the City and County of San**  
7 **Francisco, in accordance with Section 23958.4 of the California Business and**  
8 **Professions Code, with conditions.**

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10 WHEREAS, Beth Aboulaforia is seeking a transfer of a Type 20 off-sale beer and  
11 wine license from 566 Minnesota Street to 101-4th Street for Target Corporation dba  
12 City Target; and,

13 WHEREAS, The Planning Department has verified that the area is properly  
14 zoned and recommends approval; and,

15 WHEREAS, The Police Department recommends that the alcoholic beverage  
16 license application be approved with conditions; now, therefore, be it

17 RESOLVED, That in accordance with Section 23958.4 of the California Business  
18 and Professions Code, the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San  
19 Francisco hereby determines for the foregoing reasons that the transfer of a Type 20  
20 off-sale beer and wine license from 566 Minnesota Street to 101-4th Street to Beth  
21 Aboulaforia for Target Corporation, dba City Target, will serve the public convenience or  
22 necessity of the people of the City and County of San Francisco.

23 Conditions: (1) Sales and service of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted  
24 between the hours of 7:00 am and 10:00 pm daily except that from Thanksgiving to New  
25 Years Eve, sales of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted from 7:00 am to 12:00 am

1 and on the day after Thanksgiving, the day before Christmas and the day after  
2 Christmas, sales of alcoholic beverages shall be permitted from 6:00 am to 12:00 am.  
3 (2) No more than 5% of the square footage of the premises will be used for the display  
4 of alcoholic beverages. (3) No malt beverage shall be sold with an alcoholic content  
5 great than 5.7% by volume, except for microbrews, craft brews, organic, and specialty  
6 malt products sold under such designations as stout, porter, IPA, and ESB. This  
7 condition is intended to eliminate high alcohol, low-cost products that are frequently  
8 abused, but not prevent the sales of specialty and craft beer products. (4) The sale of  
9 single beer or malt beverages in quantities of 16 oz., 22 oz., 32 oz., 40 oz., or similar  
10 size containers is prohibited. (5) No beer or malt beverages shall be sold in quantities  
11 of less than manufacturer pre-packaged four packs per sale. No wine-coolers or beer  
12 coolers shall be sold in less than manufacturer pre-packaged multi-unit quantities of four  
13 (4). (6) No wine shall be sold with an alcoholic content of greater than 15% by volume  
14 except for "Dinner Wines", which have been aged two years or more and maintained in  
15 corked bottles. (7) Wine shall not be sold in bottles or containers smaller than 750 ml.  
16 unless sold in manufacturer's prepackaged multi-unit quantities.

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
