

### Tenant Assistance Programs

### Exiction Prevention & Housing Stabilization

Preventing the displacement of San Franciscans from their homes is both affordable housing preservation and cultural preservation

- \$60M+ annually via MOHCD to CBOs
- Homelessness prevention collaboration with Dept. of Homelessness & Supportive Housing
- Community-based, extensive, and innovative
- Service recipients are predominantly BIPOC, severely rent burdened, and have extremely low and very low incomes

### Tenant Assistance Programs

### Four Program Areas

# Eviction Legal Defense

- Tenant Right to Counseullscope legal representation to the maximum extent possible
- 2,200 households served annually
- Virtually allhouseholds facing eviction who avail themselves of helpeceive legal assistance
- 8 CBO providers

# Financial Assistance / ERAP

- Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP)
- Financial assistance of various types and duration
- 3,100 households served annually
- 9 CBO providers

# Tenant Rights Education

- Know-Your-Rights campaigns, onen-one counseling
- 1,500 households served annually
- 7 CBO providers

### Mediation

- Alternative Dispute
  Resolution (ADR) of all
  types for tenants and
  landlords
- Technical assistance for City-subsidized housing providers
- 600 households served annually
- Partnership with the Bar Association of San Francisco

# Additional Anti-Displacement Strategies

### **Small Sites Program**

- Nonprofits purchase atisk privatelyowned buildings and convert to permanently affordable units
- Tenant AMI range 30%20%

### **DAHLIA: Affordable Housing Lottery**

- CBOs provide counseling services to affordable housing applicants
- 20% of available ttery units can be set aside for applicants with Displaced Tenant Housing Preference (DTHP)

# MCHCDFY24-25 Budget Proposal

- Eviction and Anti-Displacement Services
  - MOHCD has not identified specific cuts in these service areas
  - MOHCD provided MBO with a variety of options & scenarios with the goal of eliminating or minimizing impacts on all CBO grants for FY24-25
- Emergency Rental Assistance Program (ERAP)
  - FY23-24 funded in part with one-time funding from FY21-22 AAO and Supplemental Appropriation 48-21
  - One-time fund sources are winding down; OCOH spending is increasing
  - Funding levels for FY24-25 depend on OCOH final budget for 24-25 and potential unexpended MOHCD general funds that would be carried forward



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
