12 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

14 Section 1. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in
15 this ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public
16 Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the
17 Board of Supervisors in File No. 140725 and is incorporated herein by reference.

18 Section 2. Following a public hearing on June 18, 2014, the Department of Public
19 Works issued Order No. 182703 approving the establishment of an underground district on
20 Ringold Alley between 8th and 9th Streets.

21 Section 3. In accordance with the provisions of Section 900, et seq. of Article 18 of the
22 San Francisco Public Works Code, the Board of Supervisors does hereby create the following
23 underground district:

Underground District No. 360

Ringold Alley


24 District covering Ringold Alley from the southwesterly line of 8th Street to the northeasterly
25 line of 9th Street.

1 Section 3. The undergrounding of facilities within this underground district is in the
2 general public interest in that said action will eliminate a heavy concentration of overhead
3 wires. In addition, consistent with the Western South of Market Neighborhood Market
4 Transportation Plan, undergrounding these utility facilities will enable the development of a
5 "shared street" on Ringold Alley.


6 Section 4. All work in connection with the undergrounding of facilities lying within this
7 underground district is to be completed in accordance with the Department of Public Works
8 program and is subject to the laws related to the establishment and completion of
9 underground districts contained in Article 18 of the Public Works Code. Such work shall be
10 commenced and completed at such times and in such stages as the Department of Public
11 Works shall establish.

12 Section 5. Effective Date. This ordinance shall become effective 30 days after
13 enactment. Enactment occurs when the Mayor signs the ordinance, the Mayor returns the
14 ordinance unsigned or does not sign the ordinance within ten days of receiving it, or the Board
15 of Supervisors overrides the Mayor's veto of the ordinance.



DIRECTOR'S DECISION REGARDING 4TERRA'S REQUEST TO CREATE AN UNDERGROUND DISTRICT ALONG RINGOLD ALLEY FROM 8TH STREET TO 9TH STREET

DESCRIPTION OF REQUEST: UNDERGROUND DISTRICT ALONG RINGOLD ALLEY

BACKGROUND:

1. The Western South of Market Neighborhood Market Transportation Plan, adopted by the San Francisco County Transportation Authority Board in March 2012, recommended the implementation of a "shared street" design, which incorporates the development of an underground district along Ringold Alley
2. On **June 18, 2014**, Department of Public Works ("DPW") Hearing Officer **Debra Temple** conducted a hearing on the proposal to create an underground district along Ringold Alley.
3. At the hearing, Lynn Fong, DPW, stated that the undergrounding of utility facilities within this underground district is in the general public interest because it will eliminate a heavy concentration of overhead wires. She indicated that the creation of an underground district would require utility companies who currently have overhead utilities along Ringold Alley to underground their facilities, subject to an appropriate design. Furthermore, all properties that currently receive utility services overhead will also need to upgrade their building or residence in order to receive utility services underground.
4. At the hearing, **Mr. Amir Massih, 4TERRA**, presented a brief description of the project along Ringold including the development of commercial, retail, residential property, and a public park.
5. At the hearing, Ms. Sunny Angulo, Legislative Aide for Supervisor Kim, stated that Supervisor Kim supports the project including the undergrounding because it would create a shared street. Ms. Angulo indicated that the LGBT community also supports the project.
6. At the hearing, one member of the community testified at the hearing to express concern about the impact the construction will have on traffic and parking.

RECOMMENDATION: APPROVE the proposal to create an underground district along Ringold Alley between 8th Street and 9th Street is in the general public interest because it will eliminate a heavy concentration of overhead wires.


