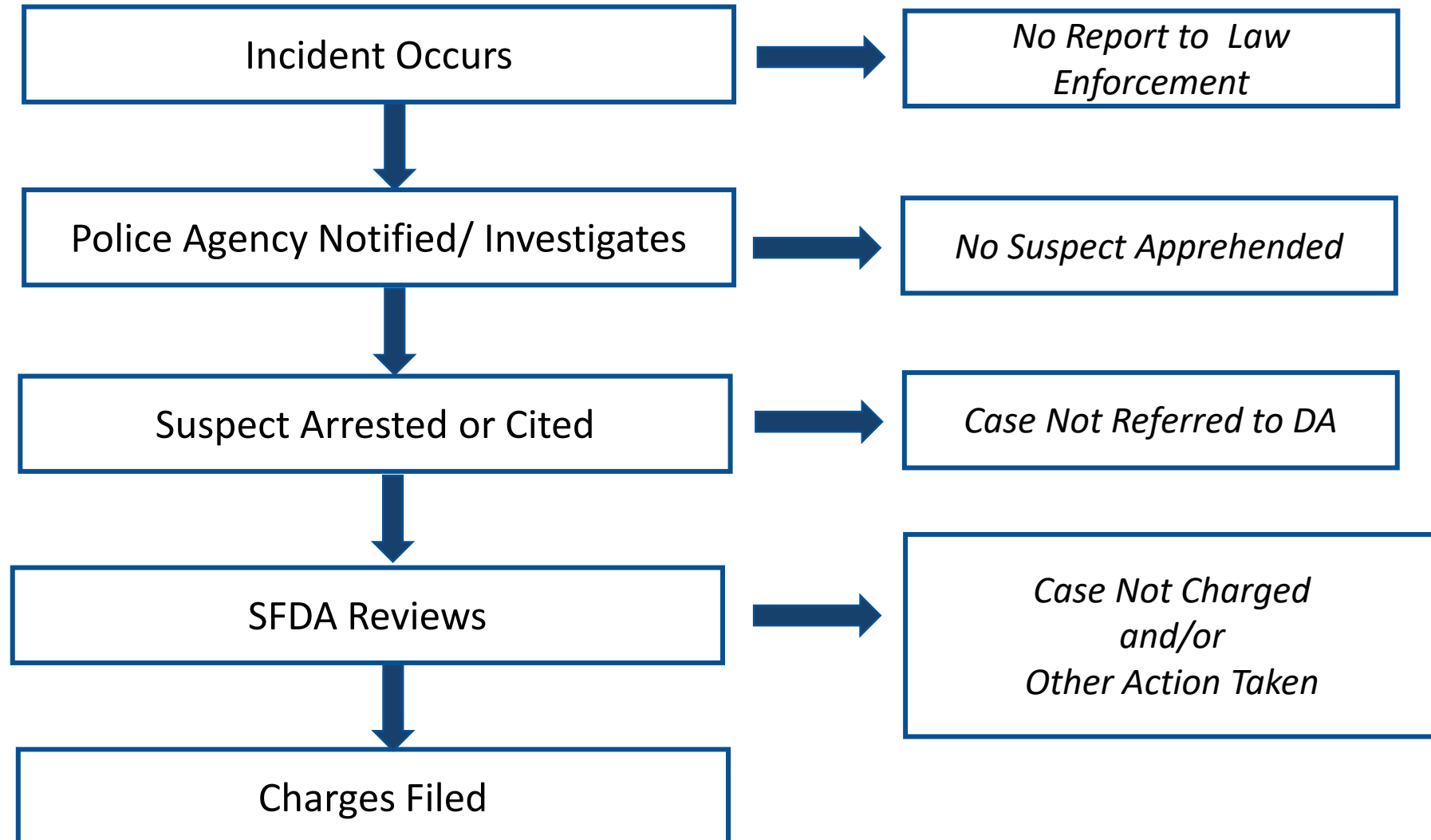

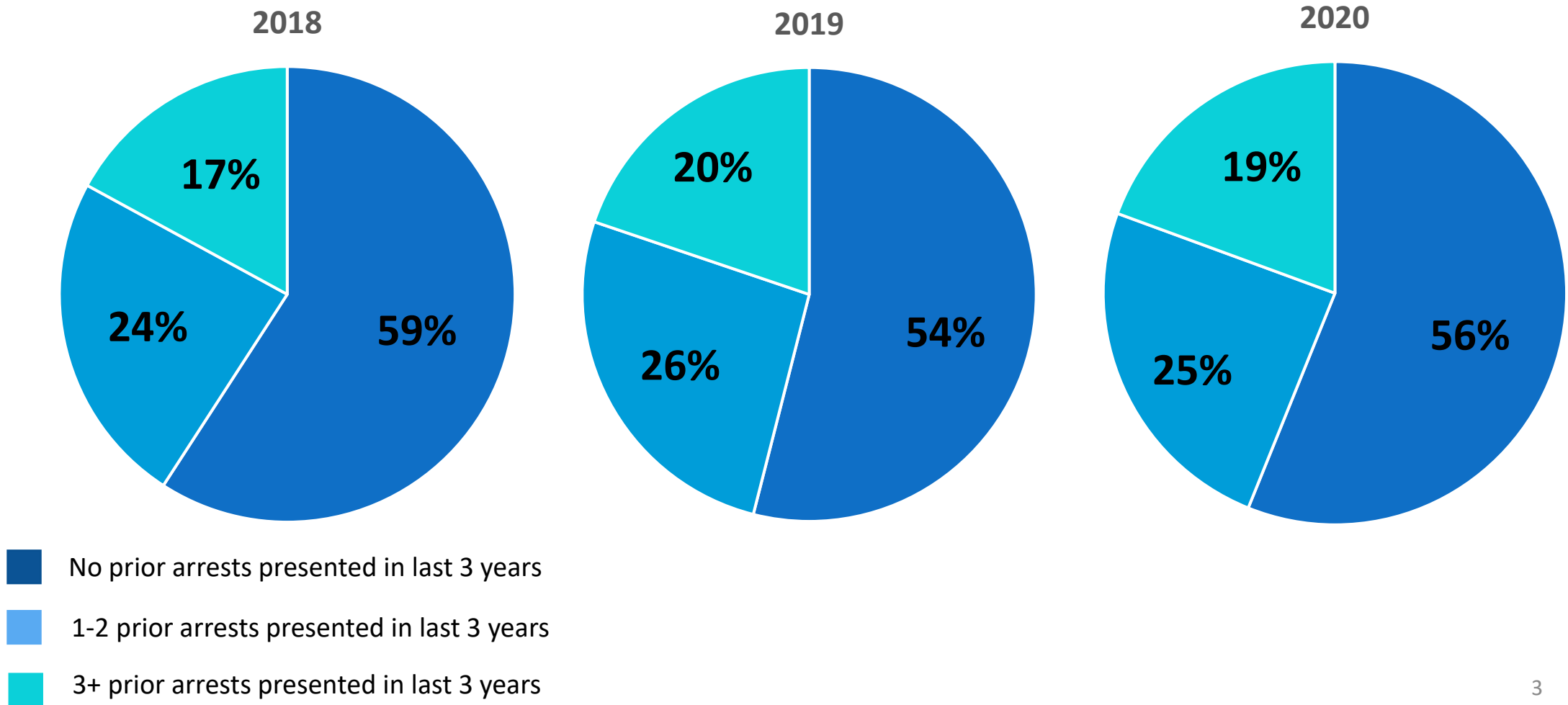

SFDA Does Not Receive All Arrests.



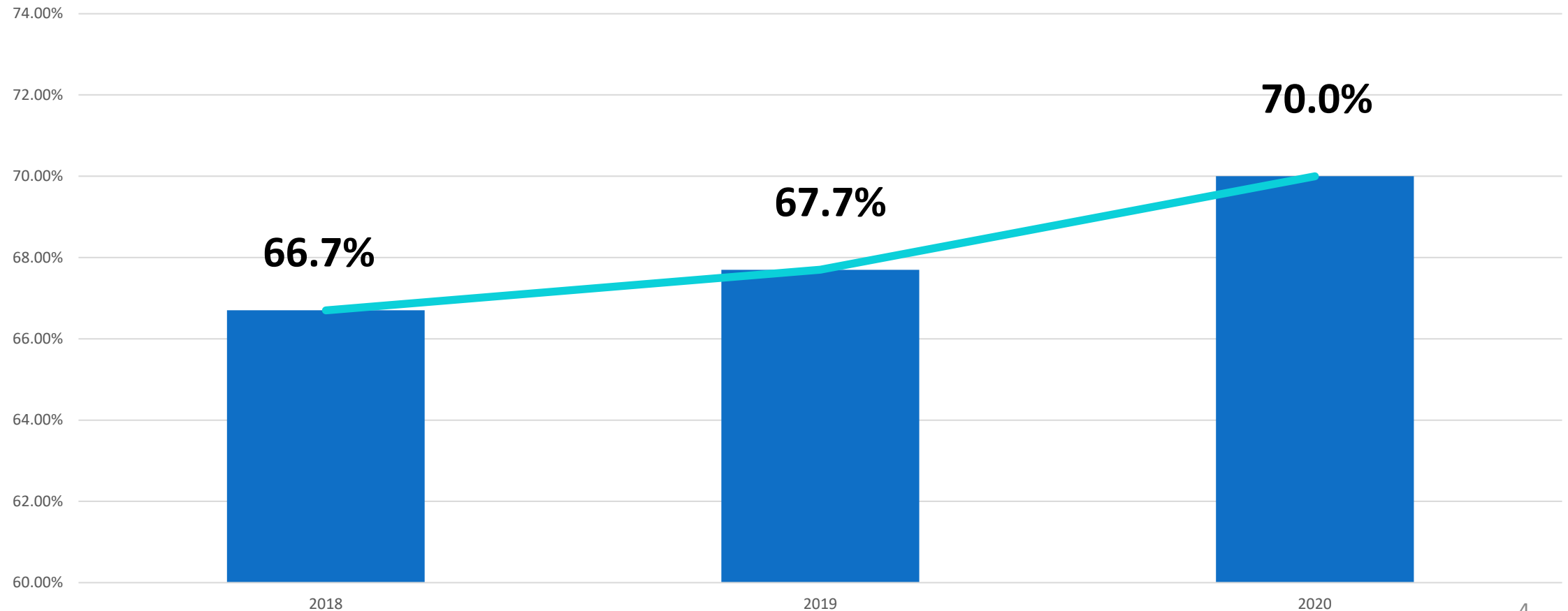


There were fewer people arrested with previous, recent arrests in 2020 than in 2019.

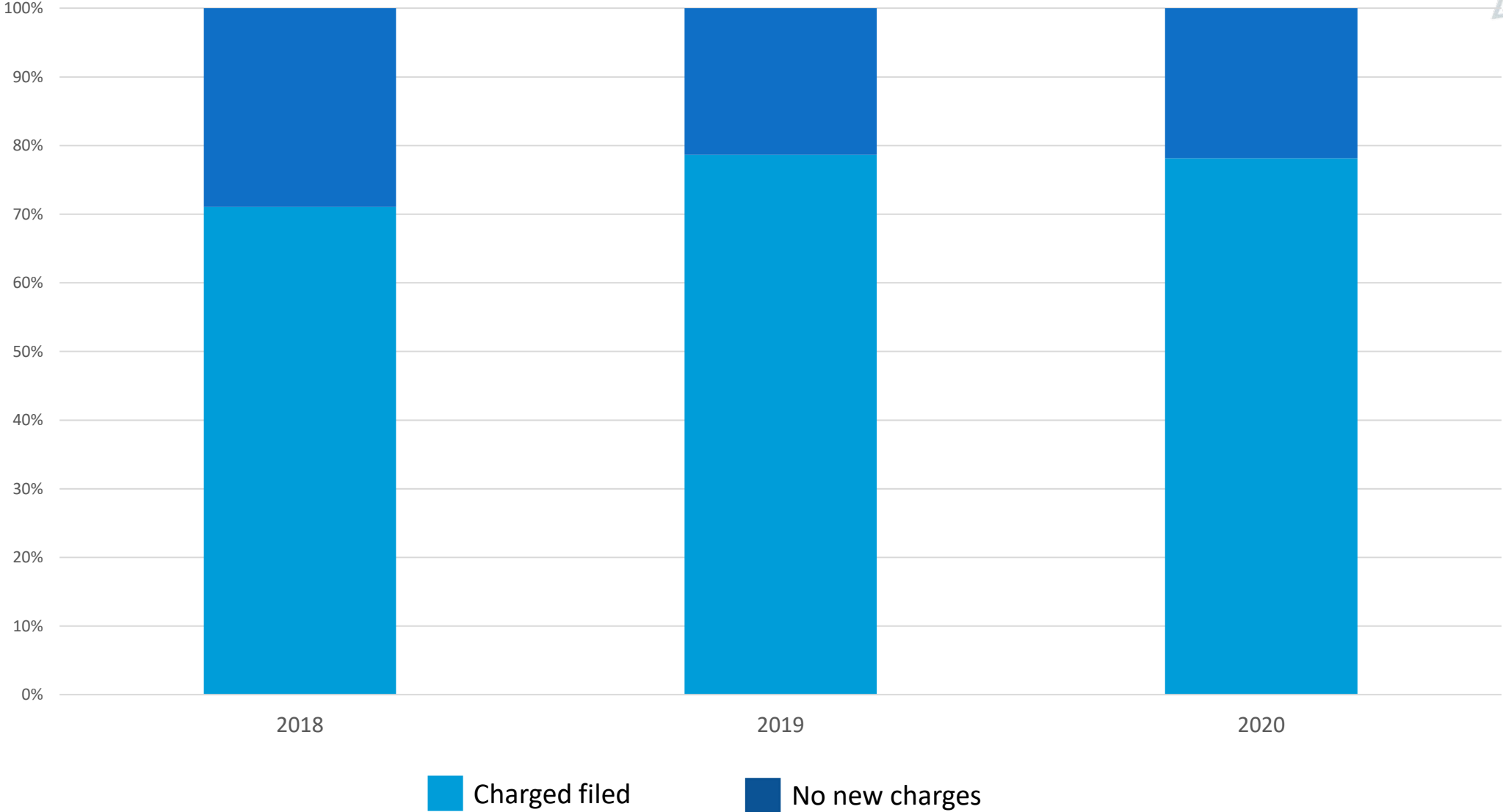




In 2020, SFDA has *increased* its filing rate of people who have been arrested multiple times.



SFDA filed charges the vast majority of times when people are arrested for drug sales who had prior recent arrests.



SFDA's Collaborative Approach to Support and Promote Community Safety



- **Facilitate better communication and coordination between SF criminal justice partners**
- **Lead with data**



Trying to do more with less



- **SFDA proactively seeks grant funding to support critical operations**
 - Victims' services
 - Jail population reduction
 - Gun analyses
- **Low staffing levels affect all operations**
 - SFDA General Felony caseload 25-50% > national standard
 - 60% increase in demand for services related to children witnessing domestic violence during the pandemic
- **Need more tools to prevent recidivism**
 - Limited resources for other efforts to increase community safety
