8	lawsuit by the city against Pacific Gas & Electric Company ("PG&E") over the discovery of		
9	toxic chemical compounds deposited into the East Harbor Marina in San Francisco,		
10	commonly known as Gashouse Cove; and		
11	WHEREAS, The settlement requires PG&E to pay up to \$190 million ("not to exceed		
12	Settlement Amount") in project costs and provide financial assurances for the project, and for		
13	the Recreation and Parks Department to reimburse PG&E up to \$29.4 million solely out of		
14	Marina revenues at no interest on a 30-year term beginning three years after project		
15	completion for remediation in the East Harbor of the Marina; and		
16	WHEREAS, As part of the settlement, PG&E agreed to fund the parties to jointly		
17	perform the planning, outreach, design, environmental review, permitting, and construction of		
18	a potential project to clean up and reconstruct the East Harbor and the adjoining West Harbor,		
19	with the intention of remediating environmental contamination, promoting environmental		
20	stewardship, and providing the public with increased recreational opportunities and water		
21	access amenities, all in a financially sustainable and holistic manner; and		
22	WHEREAS, The Recreation and Parks Department has predetermined the final project		
23	design selection process, with a vote at the Commission scheduled for October 19, 2023; and

preferred plan with inadequate community engagement and no transparency; and		
WHEREAS, The community is calling for the Recreation and Parks Department to have		
a more transparent and open process that presents all options proposed by the feasibility		
study to inform the public and make it available for community vote or input; now, therefore,		
be it		
RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Recreation & Parks Department		
to stop all actions that move their currently selected project plan forward until a thorough		
community process has been facilitated; and, be it
