Special exhibitions and public programs complement the experiences offered by the collections.






Educational experiences with Asian art for all anchor the museum's mission.




FY 2026 Proposed Budget \$12.98 million



- City budget funds approximately one-third of the costs of operating the museum.
- The City budget is primarily limited to security, utilities, insurance and a portion of the costs to maintain the City art collection and building, which helps support the museum's mission and objectives.
- The museum looks at the following performance metrics:
 - Visitors
 - School program participants
 - Public program participants
 - Museum members
 - Social and website engagements
 - Use of accessibility programs
 - Donors

AAM Budget

- Given prior year cuts and budget limited to core essentials: security, utilities, insurance, and a portion of costs to maintain the City art collection and building, the Mayor's proposed budget has no changes.
- The current budget continues to:
 - Reduce public opening hours from 6 to 5 days a week; impacting attendance, visitor experience and neighborhood recovery
 - Reduce security coverage and response times
 - Reduce number of exhibitions, public programming and SFUSD school programs, impacting attendance, visitor experience and neighborhood recovery
 - Increase risk from delaying replacement of aged infrastructure
 - Significantly limit public access to the library
 - Non-personnel budget to support building maintenance and art preservation has been reduced by \$800K or 44% since FY 2020 (not inflation adjusted)
