

1 [Lilli Ann Mural]  
2 URGING RESTORATION OF THE LILLI ANN MURAL LOCATED AT 2030 HARRISON  
3 STREET

5 WHEREAS, The Lilli Ann mural was commissioned by the City and County of San  
6 Francisco for \$36,500.00 in 1986; and,

7 WHEREAS, The Lilli Ann mural was created and painted by the late master muralist  
8 Jesus "Chuy" Campusano, with the assistance of painter and artist Elias Rocha, on the side  
9 of the Lilli Ann Corporation building at 2030 Harrison Street; and,

10 WHEREAS, The Lilli Ann mural has been, and continues to be recognized, with its  
11 brightly colored abstract art design as a great civic treasure and work of art; and,

12 WHEREAS, The vibrant design of the Lilli Ann mural, standing four stories tall and one  
13 half city block wide, adds to the social and cultural vitality of San Francisco's Mission District;  
14 and,

15 WHEREAS, The Lilli Ann mural is one of a few abstract murals in the City and County  
16 of San Francisco; and,

17 WHEREAS, The Lilli Ann mural is one of many murals which, by their display on large  
18 building walls, have added depth and beauty to the City and County of San Francisco and  
19 have made important contributions to the economic development and revitalization of the  
20 Mission District; and,

21 WHEREAS, The Lilli Ann Corporation recently sold the building at 2030 Harrison  
22 Street to the Robert J. Cort Trust; and,

23 WHEREAS, The Lilli Ann mural added beauty to the Mission community, undisturbed,  
24 for twelve years until it was whitewashed on Saturday morning, July 25, 1998, on behalf of  
25 the building owners; now, therefore, be it

1           RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco Board of Supervisors abhors  
2 the defacement of the Lilli Ann mural; and, be it

3           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the City and County of San Francisco Board of  
4 Supervisors urges that the Lilli Ann mural be restored by the owners Robert and Vera Cort  
5 and the Robert J. Cort Trust, and preserved in its original location along 17th Street and  
6 Harrison for future generations of San Franciscans to enjoy; and, be it

7           FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board transmit a copy of this resolution  
8 to Robert and Vera Cort and the Robert J. Cort Trust.


