



While attending San Francisco State University, twenty one year old Steven Lee created Steven Lee Productions to explore and experience the nightclub, bar and entertainment industry. He rented venues and formatted the music for over 100 large capacity events, four clubs and dozen of five star hotels in San Francisco. He quickly compiled a database of over 8,000 patrons that could be informed of any event in the future. He designed and printed the flyers, peeled the label, licked the stamped and went to the post office.

Within a few years, Steven went into booking and managing several top 40's dance bands, produced a concert with a #1 top Sony recording group The Jets, and organized three San Francisco / Los Angeles party tour to Hawaii, (aka Tri-city convention) fifty to one hundred people attended. Steven's repeat visits to Honolulu help him expand the business further by bringing hot nightclub shows (Society of Seven) and recording artists (Kalapana) from Waikiki hotels, to relocated Hawaiians and tourist in the Bay Area.

As the 90's came around, Steven Lee's crowd matured and had good paying jobs. They became more sophisticated and were more of a couple crowds and less of the single scene. Steven explored the possibility of having events in stylish restaurants, with after dinner dancing events. Convincing owners to let him take over the restaurant after 10pm. Parking latest target of San Francisco clubs crackdown

Parking lots are the latest target of efforts to quell late-night violence associated with clubgoers that's plagued The City for the past few years.

Shootings, stabbings, fights and other violence involving nightclub patrons prompted officials to crack down on entertainment venues with measures such as requiring promoters to register with The City and giving the Entertainment Commission authority to revoke the permits of troublesome clubs.

Now new legislation expected to be introduced Tuesday would require parking lots near nightclubs to take some responsibility in late-night safety measures. Board of Supervisors President David Chiu and Supervisor Scott Wiener drafted the legislation with help from City Attorney Dennis Herrera.

"We're asking [parking lot] operators to stand up and make sure The City is safe," Chiu said. "Oftentimes patrons leave clubs and congregate in the parking lots and violence tends to happen. Club owners have done their part, it's time to ask lots to help make this city safer."

If approved, parking lots and garages within 1,000 feet of a nightclub would be required to enhance lighting in entrances, doorways and stairwells. Staff would have to be on site until 3 a.m. Operators would be required to comply when applying for annual permits. The City Attorney's Office would be able to issue civil penalties for noncompliance.

Currently, few parking lot personnel are on site when clubs close for the night, according to Chiu.

The legislation is in reaction to violence associated with nightclubs over the past several years. The most violent incidents have occurred outside venues after hours.

Steven Lee, owner of the Glass Kat in South of Market, said his security guards will often walk patrons to their cars as a safety precaution, but that can create additional problems.

"At 2 a.m. when we let out, there's no one in the lots who can help us; we're on private property," Lee said. "It can be too far away. So then we have to call police for help."

Last year, police recommended club owners install cameras, metal detectors and ID scanners to combat violence. That legislation has not been approved.

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Hooligans in the parking lot!

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Watch out for hooligans! (Union Square garage, 1952)

Bands of hooligans are hanging out in San Francisco parking lots, and that needs to stop, say supervisors David Chiu, Scott Weiner and City Attorney Dennis Herrera.

They've crafted legislation that will require parking lot owners to make their asphalt lots and garages more secure, brighter and, in some cases, staffed later.

The issue, the three say, is that bands of young ruffians (they didn't use that phrase, but boy we wish they did) spend their evenings hanging out in vacant parking lots usually filled with commuter cars. When they interact with revelers leaving nightclubs, hijinks ensue.

This upsets club owners, who say they are getting unfairly blamed for the parking-lot revelry.

"Something we should not be putting on the entertainment industry is a responsibility to deal with our society's violence issues," Wiener said.

The law will require that parking lots and garages submit a security plan, which may require them to improve lighting or fencing. Those within 1,000 feet of an entertainment establishment will be required to have a security guard or attendant on duty until 3 a.m. The legislation will be formally introduced Tuesday.

"This will send a message to the people outside of San Francisco who come here to a nightclub or bar that they will be safe," said Steven Lee, the general manager of the Glas Kat nightclub.

But parking lot operators, aren't so sure they like the idea.

"They want us to do what?" Tahir Zira, the owner of American West Parking said when we told him about the proposed law. "How can you keep the people there until 3 a.m., you have to pay them? That's crazy. That makes no sense."

Zira, who owns six lots throughout the city, said he wasn't sure it was safe for his attendants to sit in their little booths that late at night. Crime can be a problem, but not his problem, he said.

"Whatever they say is a good for the city," he said referring to city officials, "I think it is not good."

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Beyond Dinners: Making Fundraising More Fun Promoter Wants To Set Up Permanent Money Source

SAN FRANCISCO -- Even the most casual observer of Asian American affairs in this town is aware that fundraising dinners are about the biggest thing happening as far as entertainment is concerned. During any given week one can attend at least half a dozen events and pay anywhere from \$10 to \$1,000 for a plate of food and the chance to hear a bunch of speeches. Often the same circle of people attends most of these functions; many of the same speakers give similar speeches at many of the dinners.

Not to knock the beneficiaries and their causes; these dinners provide valuable support for community agencies which in

turn give local residents very crucial health services, child care, employment training, etc.

But Steven Lee wants to add a bit of spice to the menu.

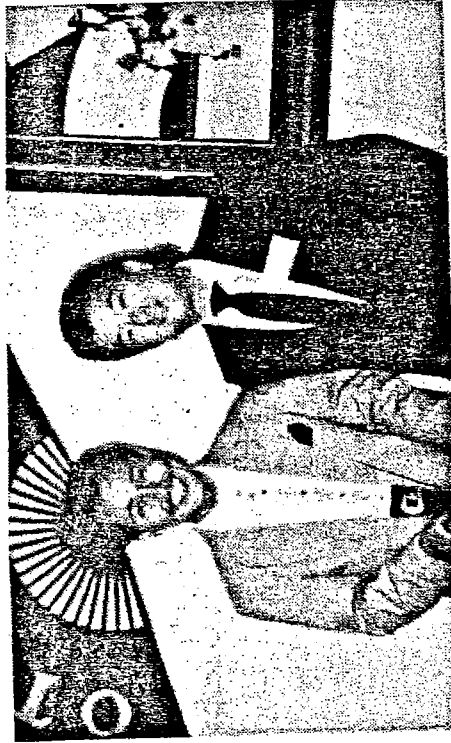
A veteran promoter who has staged about 75 dances, concerts and other special events since 1977, and has worked on a regular basis with a dozen nightclubs in the Bay Area, Lee recently broke new ground with a four-day art show. The show exhibited the works of renowned Japanese artist Hisashi Otsuka, and a portion of the proceeds from the sales of his prints went to non-profit agencies such as the Foundation for Chinese Democracy, the Japantown Art & Media Workshop and the Asian Women's Resource Center.

"We sold \$215,000 worth of art works at the Otsuka show," and patrons had the chance to designate which agency they wanted their purchases to benefit, Lee said.

The success of the art show opened new vistas for Lee. He now envisions organizing theatrical productions, concerts, comedy shows, dances and art exhibits to raise money for deserving non-profit agencies.

This would be a permanent fundraising structure, sort of an Asian American United Way, he said.

This year, for instance, Lee will collaborate with filmmaker Arthur Dong, producer/director of the recent "Forbidden City USA" documentary about the famed

Chinese American nightclub, to recreate another nightclub of the past, the Chinese Sky Room. The nightclub's former owner, Andy Wong, would also work on the project, as well as the club's original entertainers or their students.

He also plans to stage:

- a jazz concert featuring Asian American performers;
- another art show, this one for Caroline Young;
- a comedy show with top

Asian American comics from throughout the nation;

- concerts for the Filipino American Bands Society of Seven (from Hawaii) and Night Shift (from the Bay Area).

Otsuka to Attend Each Day Showing 5-Day Lennon/Otsuka Art Show Fundraiser

In an unprecedented gesture of unity, 10 of the San Francisco Bay Area's leading Chinese and Japanese non-profit organizations are presenting "East Meets West Meets East," a fundraising art show featuring the works of the renowned and popular Asian artist Hisashi Otsuka combined with selected lithographs from the work of the late Beatle John Lennon. A portion of the proceeds from the show will go to the Beijing Students Democracy Fund. Otsuka will be in attendance each night of the show.

The show will take place from Wednesday, Aug. 30 through Sunday, Sept. 3 at 1500 Howard at 11th st. in San Francisco, a new gallery space and formerly the site of the Winston Tire Co. Hours are from 5 to 11 p.m. each day. An admission donation is requested in the amount of \$15, and includes complimentary hors d'oeuvre and entertainment. For reservations or further ticket information, or to donate to the exhibit, the public can call (415) 346-1188.

The organizer of this unusual event is Steven Lee, a young art collector and longtime promoter of social events in San Francisco's Asian community, in association with Ditano Amenta, a San Francisco-based fine art publisher and off-Broadway producer who is one of the few licensed publishers of the works of John Lennon.

"This show is not so much based on a thematic connection between the two artists," said Lee, "except that both Otsuka and Lennon are known for their expressions of caring and generosity toward humanity and for their nurturing of the human spirit. The Lennon estate donates funds from the sale of all of John's work to Amnesty International and other world peace organizations. Otsuka, too, directs much of the profits from his art to charities. We contacted his representatives in Hawaii about our idea for a joint show, and they said he would be delighted to participate."

Within the past decade Otsuka has become one of the most sought after artists by collectors throughout the United States and Europe, as well as in his native Japan, and has been the sensation of both the prestigious New York and Los Angeles Art Expos for the past several years. Starting at age 15, Otsuka spent eight years of rigorous training in traditional Japanese painting at the hands of the legendary kimono designer Tadeo Jo. During the first three years of his apprenticeship, the talented young Otsuka was permitted no more than to mix paints and clean the master's brushes. Otsuka eventually went on to create his own distinct style, bringing to the ancient dedication to detail and classical design the bold colors and fluid motion of his adopted Hawaii.

The results have been heralded by collectors and critics around the world. It is not unusual today for his new works to be sold out before their actual release to the public. Among his most acclaimed works are several groups of themed series, including "Twelve

Kimonos," "The 36 Immortal Poets," "The Spirit of Musashi," "Lady Miedo," "Chushingura (49 Ronin)," and most recently the "Hanayome" brides series. "East Meets West," one of his early signal works, achieved such widespread admiration in Hawaii that it was adopted as a logo by organizations ranging from the Japanese Women's Association to the Bank of Hawaii. The Otsuka works on display at the "East Meets West Meets East" show will include some not previously available to the public.

Many of the Lennon pieces that will constitute the remainder of the show are comprised of hand-signed, limited edition lithographs from the famous Bag One series. The show also will include selected works of E. Mary Martin's sculptures derived from Lennon's lithographs and licensed through Amenta's Diamond art publishing company. Many of these same pieces were on display at the highly successful "The Art of John Lennon" show at the Contract Design Center in San Francisco this past May.

"The aim of our show is unity," said Lee. "Otsuka is the perfect artist to express the feelings of many of us young Asian Americans, combining as he does the traditional values with very exciting and very contemporary expression. John Lennon represents something else, the typical Western artistic approach of smashing against all the rules. He, too, holds great appeal for many Asian Americans within my generation."

"East Meets West Meets East" is supported by 10 of the Chinese and Japanese community's foremost charitable organizations, with more expected to add their support in the weeks before the show. It is particularly noteworthy that none of these long-established groups has ever previously participated in a joint fundraising.

"People in the community keep telling me they don't know how I'm pulling this off," said Lee. "I think it's just that the time is right."

The portion of the funds raised that will go to the Beijing Students Fund will be directed through the Foundation for Democracy in China, which recently hosted the San Francisco appearance of four of the key figures in the Tiananmen Square uprising, now heading the international Democratic Front for China.

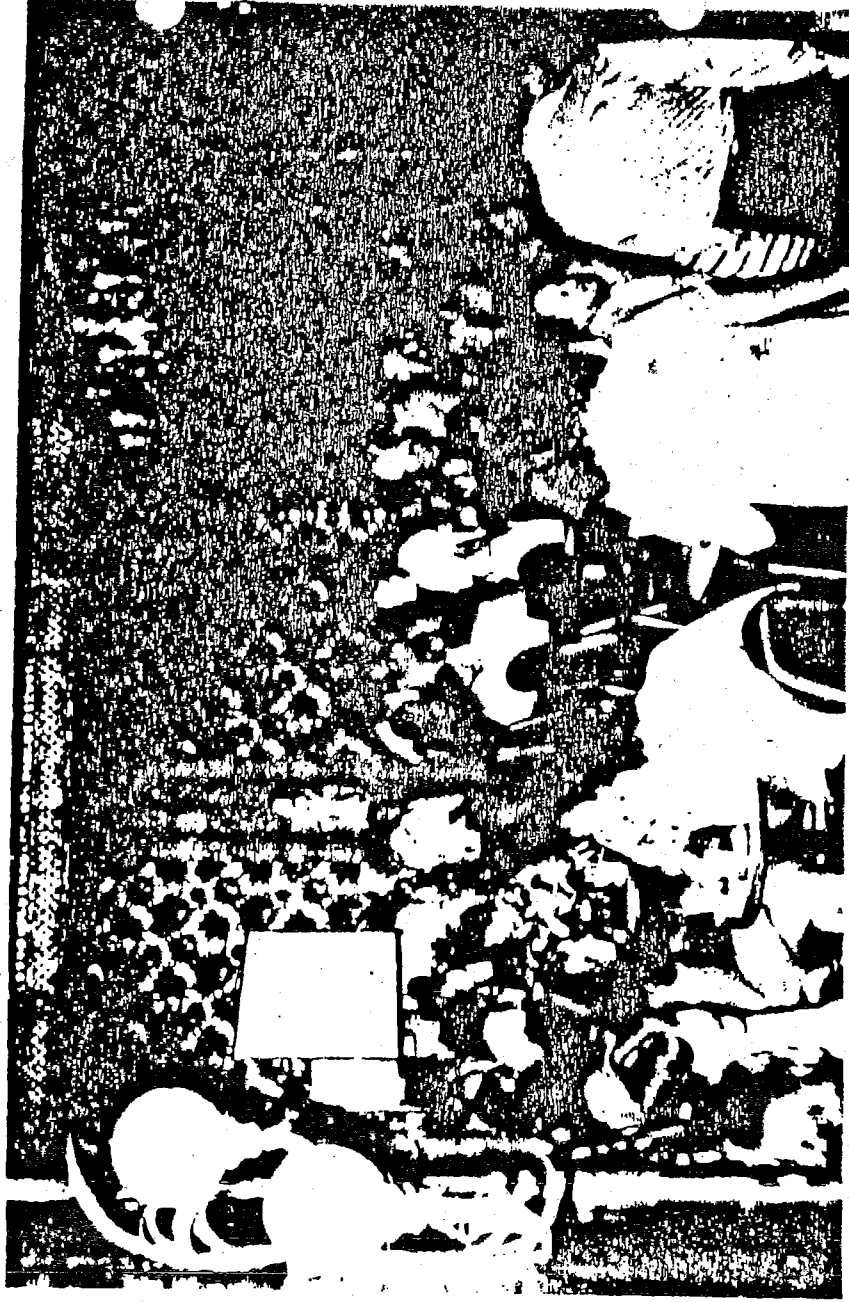
Tri-city party for Asian Americans

Imagine yourself as a young Asian American adult from the Mainland visiting the Islands. At some point during your stay, you have a desire to meet and get to know *local* people here, but there is a problem. You don't know anyone in the Islands or you might just know a few. How do you get around this problem?

This is the question that Roger Shigaki, Dennis Suzuki and Steven Lee have tried to answer through their event called the Tri-City Party, an annual party bringing together Asian Americans from Los Angeles and San Francisco and local people in Honolulu. From the success of the first two they have held so far, it seems they have hit upon an answer that is very popular. In the first year, they were able to bring over about 200 Mainland Asian Americans, and this year, their August 20th party at the Pacific Beach Hotel's Oceanarium Grand Ballroom drew a total of over 600 party goers despite a drop to about 100 Mainlanders due to economic conditions in the Mainland and the airlines' price wars earlier in the year, which prompted visitors to come then.

Explaining the concept of the event, Shigaki, a real estate broker who has been throwing small and large parties off and on for the last 13 years, says, when people visit here and want to meet people, they start with friends or friends of friends and slowly meet more people. Added to this is the problem that the process of getting to know people also takes a while—time which visitors on a week to two week vacations don't have. As a consequence, he says, they don't really meet too many local people. Shi-

gaki explains, as an answer to this, the Tri-City Party, which happens at the beginning of the visitors' tour, tries to provide "a good environment," composed of a nice place to meet, good music to listen and dance to and, importantly, a comfortable peer

group of a limited age range, mid-twenties to early thirties, to mingle with. The result of the party, he says, is that visitors have contacts and beginning friendships to build on throughout the rest of their visit.

Explaining the Asian American angle to the party, Lee, the Mainland tour organizer, says it doesn't necessarily have to be Asian American visitors. But the reason it is, he indicates, is because his company, Party Crowd Production, is one of the few producers of entertainment services exclusively for the Asian American community in Los Angeles and San Francisco. He says Asian Americans are his clientele. And it seems the Tri-City Party will probably retain the Mainland Asian American connection for a while since both Lee and Shigaki do not want to complicate the good working relationship that exists by adding more partners.

However, this doesn't mean that there will not be further developments of the Tri-City concept. Besides the already scheduled third annual party Honolulu on August 12, 1983, Shigaki states that he and Suzuki, who is a travel agent, hopefully will in the near future begin a production company here that will take local people to the Mainland for Tri-City events, bringing the idea full circle.

Travel Agent Shares Some of Hawaii's Sun and Fun Spots

SAN FRANCISCO — First-time visitors to Hawaii face common problems, such as how to save money and get the best deals; meeting new people and finding out where the locals go. If this is your situation, then maybe you should check out the Tri-City Convention, an annual party and tour in Honolulu which brings together Asian Americans from SF, LA and Hawaii.

"It's a good deal if you want to meet people, and you don't know where to go," said Steve Lee,

manager of Party Crowd Production Entertainment and Travel Service. Lee's agency coordinates the tour for the SF-Bay Area. "The convention is geared toward meeting people and developing friendships. "If you don't make it at the party, you'll meet people on the group," explained Lee.

GOOD TIME

"We make the arrangements; show you what places to go; and make sure that everyone has a good time," assured Lee. Cost of the eight-day, seven-night tour is \$399. Lee has coordinated the Tri-City Convention since 1981.

Lee said that the idea for the Tri-City Convention started when he and Roger Shigaki, a real estate broker who throws parties in Hawaii decided to put on a get together which would bring mainland Asians to Hawaii.

"The first year we let travel agents handle everything and they bungled it," Lee exclaimed. "(Nevertheless) we were still able to bring over about 200 people from SF and LA and about 500 local people."

The experience led Lee to get into the travel business, and now handles all the arrangements for the convention. "We sell mostly Hawaii trips all year, so we know the best deal," he declared. "Most of the people we draw are Asian Americans in their mid-twenties and up. Our market is primarily Asians so we do a little more like showing them where the best nightclubs are or which sushi bars are good."

SUGGESTIONS

Some of the places Lee suggested Asians should check out were Rumours Nightclub at the Ala Moana Americana Hotel in Oahu. "It's the most popular Asian hangout, but they have a very tight dress code," he said.

He also recommended Steel Wings at the Westin Ilikai Hotel, the Point After at the Hawaiian Regent Hotel and Cillys at the Royal Aloha Hotel. "Most of the discos are dead on the weekdays. It's better to go on weekends when all the locals go," he advised.

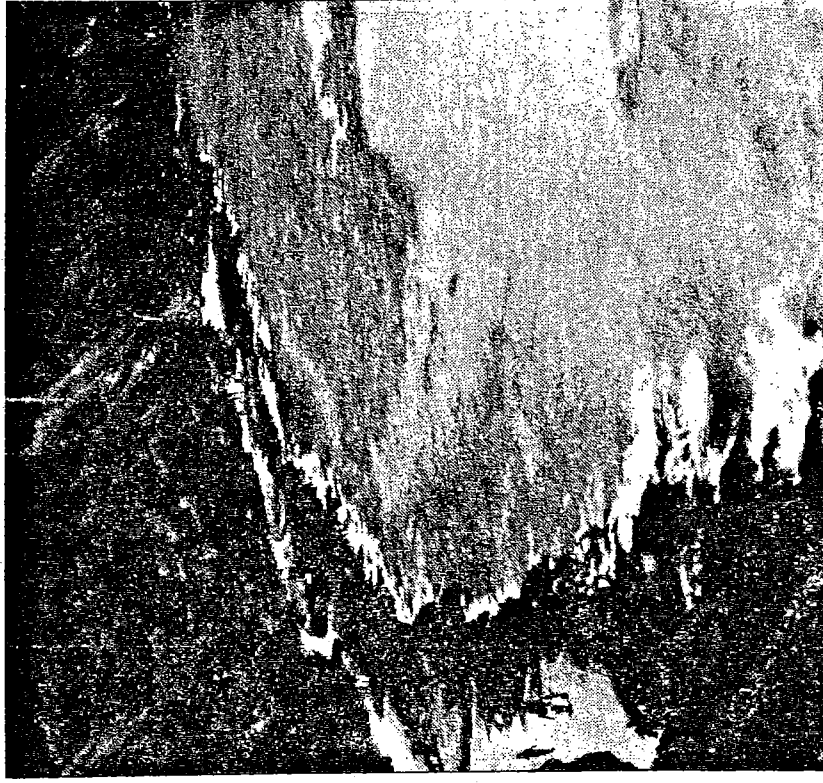
Another activity Lee recommended was snorkeling at Hanauma Bay. "It's the best and hottest beach," he declared. "It's a fish sanctuary. When you go snorkeling, the fish are real big and they come up to you so you can feed them."

"Try not to take a cab. Buy your macadamia nuts at Longs Drug Store and your t-shirts at the flea market at Aloha Stadium. They're usually \$3-4 dollars cheaper and of better quality," Lee said.

ZIPPY'S

"Stay away from the hotel restaurants. Eat at little fast food places. Zippy's is the most popular. It's like Denny's: they have locations all over Hawaii. But," he added, "it's much better, faster, cheaper, and they have everything."

Lee also stressed that the hotel you stay in is very important when shopping for a good package deal. "The cheapest is not always the best

quality," he cautioned. "Some might be located three or four blocks from the beach and be real old and dirty."

"The fall is a good time to go because prices drop, and it's still nice, but not as crowded," Lee suggested. "A lot of people say winter is a good time to go, but it's wet, cold and there's usually an

overcast," said the travel manager.

"As far as the other islands go, most of the action is on Oahu. Maui and Kauai are nice for honeymooners, so if you want to get married, go to Maui," Lee said.

In the past seven years Steven Lee has thrown more than 30 parties and some 17,000 people have shown up. One party even took place at the Pacific Beach Hotel in Honolulu.

"Well, I do it because there's a certain amount of profit," the executive producer of Party Crowd Production grinned. "And it's something I like to do."

Lee started holding dance functions when he was a student at San Francisco State University, and gradually made a name for himself among the "party crowd." The entertainment agency that he formed then has since expanded and now offers other services to its clientele, which is 90 percent Asian.

"We try to promote the Asian outlook," Lee said. "And we are always trying to make our parties a little different from the others." The innovative ideas that come out of the Party Crowd Production staff have resulted in boat dances, dances that included fashion shows promoting Asian models, and dances in places that have never held such functions before, such as Maxwell Plum's.

Lee said the people who go to his parties know what to

expect and "for six years, I've had the reputation of holding classier functions with dressy attire."

"A lot of people have asked me 'why don't you hold a party at this place or that?' because these places would attract a lot of business, but these places have to meet my criteria. There are some places where I wouldn't throw parties because it would kill my clientele."

Party Crowd Production, which handles about 10 Asian bands in the Bay Area, was also first to introduce Mr. Greenjeans—the new dance club at the Embarcadero Center in The City.

"We also pulled off the Tri-City Convention, when everybody else thought it wasn't possible."

For two years the Tri-City Convention has brought together the party crowd in San Francisco, Los Angeles and Honolulu. Held at the Pacific Beach Hotel, the big bash has annually attracted approximately 700 people, including 200 from California. Party Crowd Production organizes the travel package for the visitors from the Mainland as part of its services.

Lee intends to add Seattle to the list of cities that will participate in functions with the partygoers in California and Hawaii.

Catering primarily to people in their early 20s, the entertainment agency also provides travel services so clients can book tours to Europe, China and Japan, along with various cruises. Other services that Party Crowd Production offers include entertainment consulting, food catering, graphic art design, limousine services, mailing service and an answering service.

"A lot of money has been put into researching ways of better serving our clients, and it's starting to pay off," Lee said. He also noted that in trying to satisfy the young Asian American crowd, there's a difference in the style of music that is played at the parties. "Just like the gay crowd is more open to new music, disco or whatever, it takes the Asian crowd a little longer to like the new music; they prefer music that they hear often on the radio."

With a current mailing list of 3,000 in San Francisco and Los Angeles and 800 in Hawaii, it looks like the parties are going to last way past 2 a.m. The next Party Crowd production will be held at Choices, 50 Post Street in San Francisco, on Saturday, Jan. 29. Disco music will be featured, so check it out!

Musical astronomers report a new star rising out of the west, glowing brightly from the middle of the Pacific Ocean. "We have slowly built up a following, and our goal is to break the color barrier and be the first Asian American musical group to be a national success," commented Yemun Chung, man-

ager of the Krush, the sensational nine-member showband which has three times been named Hawaii's Group of the Year and has dominated the pop charts there. Leader of the group, Edwin

Ramones agreed. "I hope we do become trend-setters in music. Being Asian Americans and being from Hawaii is really important to us." Already billed as Hawaii's number one showband, the Krush are looking for national exposure, hoping for "that one

tune," as Ramones puts it, that will give them the big break that they need on the mainland.

When they made their national debut on network television on the Mike Douglas Show in 1981, the Krush received a standing ovation and were asked to return to do another show. They have been performing in the prestigious showrooms of Los Angeles, Las Vegas, Tahoe and Canada, and made their debut on the San Francisco scene last week at Choices Cabaret and Bimbo's.

Steve Lee of Party Crowd Production, which hosted their San Francisco appearance, believes that it won't be long before the Krush hit the big time in the continental U.S. "They're already booked to appear at Bimbo's again in September," he said.

In reviewing the group's immense success over the past five years, members stress the strong bond between themselves and manager Yemun Chung, and their commitment to music.

"It's been a learning experience," Macky Galbiso said. "Not only have we grown in our musical career but we've become a family. That's our secret for staying together. It's a lot of work, but it's worth it," he grinned.

I've got a crush

Krush Kharisma hit the mainland last week when Hawaii's hottest young contemporary showgroup brought their array of talent to the Sahara Tahoe Hotel and San Francisco's Bimbo's 365 Club and Choice's Cabaret.

Audiences in Hawaii have been singing praises for the past decade about these talented musicians and polished vocalists who have become Hawaii's most exciting attraction produced by the island entertainment industry. Yet many a patron entering the High Sierra Theatre seemed a little unsure about who they were seeing and what kind of show they were getting themselves in for.

That uncertainty ended rapidly when bursting on stage came nine appealing young men filled with youthful exuberance and energy, superb instrumental and vocal talent, charisma and lovable personalities. From the moment lead singer Bobby Gonzales beckoned the au-

dience to join them in a big Aloha Hello, the Krush had them in the palms of their talented hands!

For the 1940s folks, of which I must admit being a member, the Krush does do a string of Glenn Miller tunes—"Tuxedo Junction," "In the Mood"—all faithfully revived right down to the band being dressed in Army uniforms during the mellow clarinet solo on "Moonlight Serenade." Their "Don't Sit Under the Apple Tree" number with Bobby Gonzales on vocal, is a crowd-pleaser with Wade Kuroiwa jitterbugging in, be-wigged and skirted like a bobby soxer. As the audience clapped and reminisced, the rest of the Krushers did a march/dance to the strong beat of "American Patrol."

"Darryl Avarico, Edwin Ramones and I played in the school band in Waiialua, and unbelievably that was ten years ago," said Wade Kuroiwa.

Waiialua is a sleepy plantation community on Oahu's north shore where the simple

When they were students at Waialua High School, Ramones, Kuroiwa and Alvarico decided to form a band and take part in a talent contest. Two more members brought the fledgling group's total to five.

As one of the 25 disco and Top-40 bands that Chung's agency, Windefall Artists' Management, represented, the Krush were first known as the Exotic Five and then the New Experience. They were asked to be the back-up group for singer Anna Lea, a move they were reluctant to make at first. But it paid off and Anna Lea and the Fabulous Krush became one of the biggest draws at the Hilton-Hawaiian Village Garden Bar.

Chung instilled in them the belief that the Krush would be a success if they would be willing to put energy and determination into their music. "You'll be shining examples for all Asian Americans who are willing to work hard to make great things happen," they were told.

Chung now manages the Krush full-time. They began to gain exposure in the local music scene, playing in dance contests, promotions and benefit performances and spending money on costumes, equipment, choreography and music lessons. They worked hard to learn to entertain their audience as a showband instead of just playing music.

In 1980 the Krush released its first album under their own label, Dove. It was titled "Fabulous Krush." This debut LP went on to hit number one on the local charts and won three Hoku Awards (the Hawaiian

Grammy), including "Album of the Year" and "Contemporary Album of the Year." It included several of their seven Top-10 singles in the state's market.

Attendance at their shows grew tremendously, and the group closed at the Hilton to open an engagement at the Ocean Showroom in Waikiki's Reef Hotel. They also went on to do a TV special and a concert at Honolulu's largest indoor facility, the NBC Arena. They released a second album, "The Krush" and their latest "Krush III" promises to be another winner.

"I feel that we have a lot more to learn," Ramones said. "We have been fulfilling our goals and we are moving really fast, being a major band in Hawaii. Now we are aiming at national exposure, and we have to keep

trying."

"It is a hard business. There's a lot of competition out there, so we're constantly rehearsing. I'd rather perform than rehearse, but of course you can't do one without the other," he laughed.

The band's repertoire of songs tries to "hit the young and the old," and this works well for the versatile group which plays a wide variety of different instruments in many styles ranging from country & western to swing, disco and rock. Before this switch they were mainly playing disco tunes.

Their songs reflect a deep love for Hawaii and faith in God. "In our show we try to incorporate that we are believers. And we believe that it is because of our faith we are where we're at today," Ramones said.

He noted that playing on the mainland has taught the group much about the type of audience here. One interesting ob-

servation that he made was that audiences here "love to hear the music more than they enjoy the skits, but back home the skits are more popular. I don't really know why."

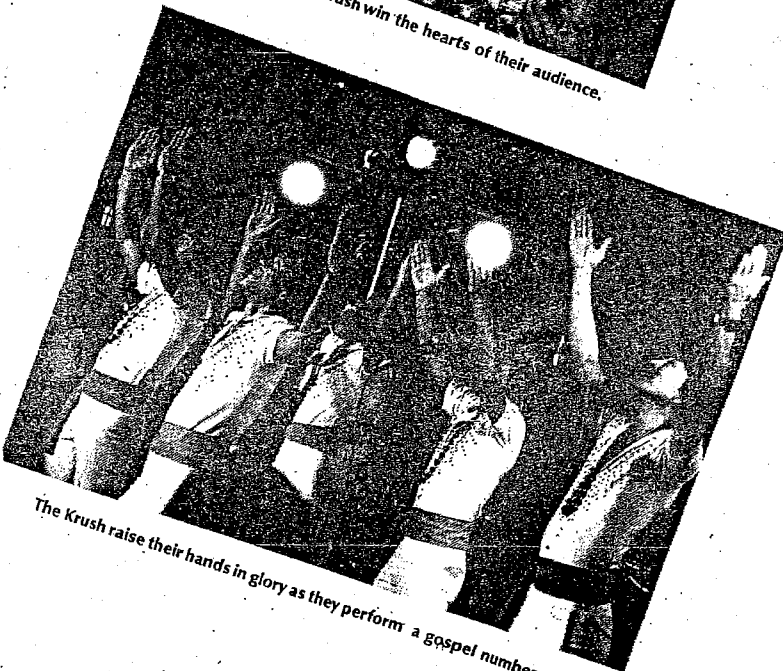
Playing here has also meant some adjustments in lifestyle. "Here it's more go, go, go and at home it's more laid back," he smiled.

Much of the material that the Krush records and performs are standards which have been written by others. The group has recognized the need for more original material and lists an album of original music as one of their goals.

"We really feed off of the audience's response (to our performance)," Macky Galbiso said. "The more the audience gives, the more we want to give to them. There have been times when there have been just a handful of people in the audience. That was discouraging at first, but then we thought that if we could make just these people happy, we would have done our best."

prevails and fame and we are considered a fantasy. This trio who played only at hometowns and dances were the Hawaiian-born children of Chinese, Japanese and Filipino laborers brought over to work on the great sugar plantations.

Ben Vegas and Jesse Gamiao, the more recent additions to the group, were born in Hawaii and both play a wide variety of instruments when on stage.

"The music business takes a lot of sacrifice," commented Butchie. "You're away a lot of time from your families and loved ones."

You have to keep on practicing and singing, even when your voice is so hoarse. But it is rewarding because I love meeting and performing in contact with so many different kinds of people."

Recently expanded to include nine members, the Krush musicians are Edwin Ramones, Bobby Gonzales, Butchie Canencia, Macky Galbiso, Philip Galaura. "Until recently we had no formal mu-

sical training. We were all self-taught with a lot of hungry drive," explained Butchie.

The backbone of Krush's success is their manager, Yemun Chung, a Vietnam hero from San Francisco who moved to Hawaii and opened Windefall Artists' Management.

"I found these guys determined and enthusiastic. I liked their tenacity, honesty and loyalty, and a cute innocence that other groups lacked," said Yemun, who in 1977 was given the Sertoma Award as Business Man of the Year.

When the Krush play straight, their music is strong, and during their show you could feel their joy of performing that made them so appealing.

Let's hope the Krush will come again to the mainland soon, to share in their own unique style of music and showmanship. If they do, guess who'll be there in the front row leading the applause for these engaging showmen.

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Asian Groups Co-Sponsor Bone Marrow Drive

DAVIS — The Cal. Aggie Alumni Association at UC Davis is co-sponsoring a drive Oct. 7 to 12 to increase the number of people registered as potential bone marrow donors.

Joining with the association to increase participation in the Sacramento Medical Foundation's Marrow Donor Program Registry are the Sacramento County, Chinese American Council of Sacramento, Asian Bar Association of Sacramento and the UC Davis School of Medicine Alumni Association.

More than 16,000 people in the U.S. are diagnosed each year with leukemia or other blood disorders that can be cured through a bone marrow transplant, according to the foundation. Though the technology exists to save many of these patients, the chances of finding a suitable donor are poor. The odds are one in 20,000 for Caucasians and one in 100,000 for

non-Caucasians. Currently, only 380,000 potential donors are listed with the registry nationwide. The alumni group's goal for the "Save a Life" campaign is to help national efforts to increase the registry to 500,000 people in the U.S. and 1 million worldwide, said Red Davis, association president.

The Cal Aggie Alumni Association, a 14,500-member organization designed to serve the university and its alumni, has selected the registry drive to be its community service project. In addition to members of the sponsoring organizations, individuals in the Sacramento and Davis are encouraged to participate.

To sign up for the registry, individuals must be between the ages of 18 and 56 and in good health. They must donate two small tubes (approximately two tablespoons) of blood and, if possible, a tax-deductible con-

tribution of \$75 to cover the cost of the test. A fund is available to pay for the cost of testing for those who cannot afford the contribution.

To make an appointment to give blood, call the Sacramento Blood Center at (916) 456-1500. Those who would like more information are invited to attend one of several coffee-and-dessert sessions being held by the sponsoring organizations. Report Says Slain Monk Had

PHOENIX — One of the monks killed last week at a local Buddhist temple said last year that the temple had received threats from the Ku Klux Klan, the Phoenix Gazette reports.

The Gazette quoted Maticchon, a daily newspaper in Bangkok, as saying that the chief monk in Arizona, the Venerable Phra-maha Paratch Promwaro Kan-thong had returned to Thailand in early December and told relatives that KKK members had disturbed him at the temple.

"But he said it was not a serious problem," Maticchon Publisher Paitir Pongpanit told the Gazette on Sunday. Six monks, a nun and two disciples were found shot to death at the Wat Promkarnaram temple. Members of Asian American communities here and on the West Coast have raised concerns that the killings were motivated by religious or racial bigotry.

Maricopa County Sheriff Tom Agnos on Tuesday discounted the hate crime theory. He has not ruled out robbery as a motive, although many valuable items in the temple were left untouched.

A source close to the investigation said that a possible "drug connection" was being examined as a motive. Agnos announced the formation of a task force including the FBI, the Phoenix Police Department and other agencies to investigate the killings. Neither the Maricopa County Sheriff's Office nor the FBI have

publicly suggested any connection between hate groups and the execution-style shootings. Civil rights groups say the anti-Asian sentiment has been on the rise in Arizona. A number of incidents were reported last year.

In September, a Chinese American Christian church Chandler was defaced with bullet holes and graffiti reading "KKK" and "No Chinks. Home to China."

In October, a cross was burned in the yard of an Asian American attorney. Also in October, the JACL president, Robert Matsushita, received death threats. Rabbi Robert Kravitz, director of the American Jewish Committee, questioned whether the KKK is involved in the incidents. Individuals with racist views or who belong to other hate groups sometimes cloak themselves with KKK symbols to hide their true identities or to terrorize their victims, he said.

Assassination Archivist and Search Center in Washington, D.C., said that manner in which the Arizona killings occur neither confirms nor rules out KKK involvement. The most recent case he recalled in which the Klan was connected with anti-Asian violence was the harassment of Vietnamese fishermen off the coast of Texas in the early 1980s.

U.S.-Cuba Group Honors Artist

Also honored were Rep. Ron Dellums (D-Berkeley), college teacher Bernardo Garcia, Pan-remos Brigade, which fosters communication between the U.S. and Cuba, the Oakland Tribune reports.

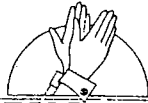

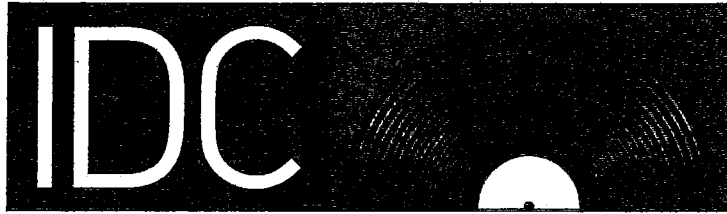

With major changes in the modern music industry, independent artists and labels seek new ways to get their music out. Steffen noticed these issues as he himself has faced distribution challenges, too. He launched Independent Distribution Collective in 2004 and since then has grown the company from 9 labels to over 350 labels with close to 500 releases in less than 7 years. In addition to launching a physical distribution company, which now includes both digital, film and DVD distribution, SOS has also developed services like "InstantDistro" a turnkey marketing and promotion service, and "A La Carte Management" which helps advance the independent music community and educate developing artists.

A dancehall reggae innovator, a DJ / producer / remixer and the owner of PSM Recordings, he has been bringing his conscious reggae vibes to throngs of people from New York to the Hawaiian Islands (and San Francisco in between) for almost 2 decades. A New York City native, SOS moved to Maui in 1991 where he broke the freshest dancehall tracks to scores of locals as well as tourists from around the globe at Studio 505, a Stephen Stills' nightclub. At that time he also managed and produced Marty Dread & Culture Shock, the most popular reggae band in the islands.

1993 brought him to San Francisco to play venues like Miss Pearl's Jam House, Kennel Club and others. Together with former partner Stefan G. (video/multimedia specialist), a brand new concept in global sound systems was formed: Positive Sound Massive. PSM features an array of international vocalists, rappers, toasters and musicians, including rapper Wookie J., whom SOS imported from Maui.



Board Qualifications:

The Entertainment Commission shall consist of 7 members comprised of 3 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors and 4 members nominated by the Mayor.

Each nomination by the Mayor shall be subject to approval by the Board of Supervisors and shall be the subject of a public hearing and vote within 60 days. If the Board of Supervisors fails to act on a mayoral nomination within 60 days of the date the nomination is transmitted to the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors, the nominee shall be deemed approved.

Of the 4 members nominated by the Mayor, the Mayor shall nominate one member to represent the interests of City neighborhood associations or groups, one member to represent the interests of entertainment associations or groups, one member to represent the interests of the urban planning community, and one member to represent the interests of the law enforcement community.

Of the 3 members appointed by the Board of Supervisors, one member shall represent the interests of City neighborhood associations or groups, one member shall represent the interests of entertainment associations or groups and one member shall represent the interests of the public health community.

To stagger the terms the initial appointments to the commission shall be as follows: the Mayor nominates two members to serve terms of four years, one member to serve a term of three years

and one member to serve a term of two years. Of the three remaining members, the Board of Supervisors shall appoint one member to serve a term of four years, one member to serve a term of three years and one member to serve a term of two years. All terms of initial appointees to the commission shall be deemed to commence upon the same date which shall be the date upon which the last of the seven initial appointees assumes office. Thereafter, all appointments and reappointments shall be for a term of four years.

The Entertainment Commission shall: 1) assist entertainment organizers and operators to apply for necessary permits; 2) promote responsible conduct; 3) promote the City's entertainment industry; 4) promote the use of City facilities; 5) foster harm reduction policies; 6) develop "good neighbor policies"; 7) mediate disputes between persons affected by entertainment events and establishments and the operators of such establishments; 8) issue entertainment related permits; 9) plan and coordinate City services for major events; 10) provide information regarding venues and services appropriate for events and functions ancillary to conventions.

Reports: Prepare and submit to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors within one year from July 6, 2002 and not less than five years thereafter a report analyzing the commission's effectiveness. Prepare and submit to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors an annual report by March 1st regarding its activities for the preceding year. Prepare and submit to the Mayor and Board of Supervisors within one year from July 6, 2002 and annually thereafter a report analyzing fee revenue.

Sunset Clause: None mentioned
