Serving over 30,000 SF families annually, we prevent child abuse and neglect by strengthening families through culturally responsive programming, two-generation parenting support, basic needs resources, and neighborhood-based case management.

The FSA wants to thank you for supporting the amended Rapid Rehousing Legislation to extend family housing subsidies to five years for at-risk families, advancing the FSA mission to ensure all San Francisco families can thrive.

Staff at our family support organizations report that securing shelter, interim housing, and permanent housing is the greatest need facing San Francisco families. While caseworkers are not housing advocates, they work tirelessly to help families find and keep stable housing, knowing this is essential for children to thrive. This legislation gives case workers the time needed to help families afford housing without subsidies, avoiding homelessness.

Preventing the revolving door of homelessness is critical, as it creates lasting trauma for children. Research shows housing instability leads to Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), triggering toxic stress and disrupting brain development, with devastating long-term effects on health, income, and education. Dear Board of Supervisors,

My name is Dr. Pegah Faed. I am a San Francisco resident and CEO of Safe & Sound. For over 50 years, Safe & Sound has been dedicated to preventing and reducing child abuse, neglect, and trauma.

Safe & Sound urges you at the **December 10, 2024** hearing, to reverse SFMTA's decision to ban overnight RV parking citywide. If the SFMTA's decision stands, it will harm San Francisco's families and children, forcing many to lose their only shelter and face life unprotected on the streets. The recent displacement of over 50 children during the Zoo Road sweeps highlights the devastating impact of this ban.

Currently, RVs serve as homes for many families, as the city lacks sufficient shelter beds and permanent housing options. Families with children, unaccompanied minors, and transitional-aged youth comprise nearly a quarter of our homeless population, with currently around 550 families on the shelter waitlist—double the number of adults waiting for assistance. Families should be offered housing that meets their needs, not temporary shelter that cycles them back to the streets. Families and children don't want to live in RVs; they want and deserve long-term homes.

By preventing unsheltered homelessness, you can significantly enhance child safety and well-being, creating a more secure family environment. Research shows that housing instability leads to Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs), triggering toxic stress and disrupting crucial brain development. Child housing instability has devastating long-term effects on health, income, and educational outcomes. Stable housing is essential for healthy child development.

Safe & Sound urges you to vote to appeal the SFMTA's city-wide RV ban. Thank you.
