RADIO TO KPFA STAFF AND ITS LISTENERS

WHEREAS, For over 50 years, KPFA has been a bastion and stalwart defender of free speech and independent journalism, ever unwavering in providing critical balance to commercial media outlets; and

WHEREAS, KPFA, is the oldest community-owned radio station in the nation, is exclusively supported by listener donations since 1949 and does not receive any funding contingent on broadcasting its sponsors' advertisements; and

WHEREAS, KPFA is committed to democracy and fulfilling the expectations of its listeners by seeking the input of its local advisory board, a body that is representative of KPFA's diverse local listener community; and

WHEREAS, By providing a forum for those who have been excluded from mainstream media outlets, KPFA upholds its covenant of free speech and fulfills its listener community's mandate for providing diverse perspectives on issues vital to a well-informed public committed to democracy and social justice; and

WHEREAS, KPFA has lately been threatened by the Pacifica Foundation actions overriding the local listener community decision making process and its commitment to democracy; and

WHEREAS, Pacifica's actions have resulted in a take over of KPFA that has been marked by censorship, the firing of staff members, the misappropriation of listener donated funds to hire security guards and a public relations firm, and the harassment and arrest of countless members of the listener community; and

WHEREAS, The Pacifica Foundation has been researching the possibility of selling KPFA to gain revenue for its own purposes, an act that would result in the loss of the greatest asset for peace and justice-related broadcasting in the Bay Area; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco hereby proclaims October 24, 1999 as "Tune in to KPFA Day" as a day to celebrate the preservation of free speech, community sponsored radio in the San Francisco Bay Area; and let it be

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Pacifica Foundation to quickly restore democratic control of KPFA Radio to KPFA staff and its listeners.
