URGING ALL SAN FRANCISCANS WHO MIGHT FIT THE QUALIFICATIONS DELINEATED

IN THE SAN FRANCISCO MUNICIPAL CODE (ADMINISTRATIVE CODE) CHAPTER 86,

SECTION 86.3 IN FURTHERANCE OF THE CALIFORNIA CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

FIRST ACT OF 1998 TO APPLY TO THE SAN FRANCISCO CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

FIRST COMMISSION.

WHEREAS, On November 3, 1998, the citizens of the State of California enacted The California Children and Families First Act of 1998 ("the Act"); and,

WHEREAS, The purpose of the Act is to promote, support, and improve the early development of children from the prenatal state to five years of age in each county; and,

WHEREAS, Pursuant to the Act, Board of Supervisors' Ordinance 409-98, approved December 24, 1998, established the Children and Families First Trust Fund and Commission to meet the goals and objectives of and be in full compliance with all of the provisions of the Act; and.

WHEREAS, The Children and Families First Commission will consist of nine members including the Director of Public Health or designee; the General Manager of the Department of Human Services or designee; a member of the Board of Supervisors; the Director of the Department of Children, Youth and Their Families or designee; and,

WHEREAS, The five additional members of the Children and Families First

Commission will be appointed from among the following categories: persons responsible for management of the following county functions: children services, public health services, behavioral health services, social services, and tobacco and other substance abuse prevention and treatment services; recipients of project services included in the county strategic plan; educators specializing in early childhood development; representatives of a

local child care resource or referral agency, the Child Care Planning and Advisory Council, or another local child care coordinating group; representatives of a local organization for prevention or early intervention for families at risk; representatives of community-based organizations that have the goal of promoting and nurturing early childhood development; representatives of local school districts; and representatives of local medical, pediatric, or obstetric associations or societies; and,

WHEREAS, It is the goal of the City and County of San Francisco to establish a diverse and experienced commission in order to create an integrated and comprehensive county strategic plan for the support and improvement of early childhood development within San Francisco; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco urges all San Franciscans who might fit the qualifications delineated in the San Francisco Municipal Code (Administrative Code) Chapter 86, Section 86.3 to apply to the San Francisco Children and Families First Commission.
