[E-budgeting For Accountability and Sustainability] URGING THE MAYOR'S BUDGET OFFICE TO WORK WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF TELECOMMUNICATIONS AND INFORMATION SERVICES AND THE BUDGET ANALYST TO INSTITUTE AN ONLINE ACCESSIBLE CITY BUDGET AND TO MAKE THE CITY BUDGET AVAILABLE IN DISK FORM FOR PERSONS REQUESTING OR HAVING A NEED FOR A COPY OF THE CITY'S BUDGET, INCLUDING THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS, IN TIME FOR THE 2001-2002 CITY BUDGET.

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has demonstrated a commitment to protecting the environment, through such actions as adopting the Sustainability Plan, instituting an ongoing recycling program (and encouraging recycling in the private sector), providing copies of the City's board and commission agendas online, strengthening the City's transit first policy, and by promoting use of cleaner fuel vehicles; and,

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has demonstrated a commitment to a more open government and greater accountability through such actions as successfully passing the recently enacted Sunshine Initiative; and,

WHEREAS, The City and County of San Francisco has demonstrated a desire to apply the lessons of successful entrepreneurship through adoption of the 1998 voter-approved Customer Service Initiative and the Performance and Review Ordinance of 1999, both of which focus on creating an customer-oriented approach to running City government; and,

WHEREAS, The state of Florida recently announced its first e-budget, available online at the following web site: http://www.state.fl.us/budget/index.html; and,

WHEREAS, To enhance accountability in the expenditure of tax dollars, this redesigned budget format lists accountability criteria next to each line item in the budget and provides detailed descriptions of expenditures; and,

WHEREAS, An e-budget promises to effect many of the same goals that the City and County of San Francisco holds in high esteem, such as greater sustainability by reducing the use of paper; and,

WHEREAS, E-budgeting promotes greater accountability through increased visibility and transparency; and,

WHEREAS, Greater accountability will, in turn, lead to higher public confidence; and,

WHEREAS, Providing copies of the City budget on CD disk or online will reduce otherwise wasteful duplication of paper; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors does hereby urge the Mayor's Budget Office to work with the Department of Telecommunications and Information Services and the Budget Analyst to institute an online accessible budget and to make the City budget available in disk form for persons requesting or having a need for a copy of the City's budget, including the Board of Supervisors, in time for the 2001-2002 City budget; and, be it,
