1	[Special Court and Public Reports Regarding "Quality of Life" Offenses.]
2	
3	Resolution urging the San Francisco Superior Court to establish a Special Court to
4	hear "Quality of Life" offenses, the District Attorney to assign Assistant District
5	Attorneys to appear at the hearings or to delegate this responsibility to the City
6	Attorney's Office, and the San Francisco Superior Court to provide the District Attorney
7	with information about court proceedings involving "Quality of Life" offenses.
8	
9	WHEREAS, Those persons who suffer from mental illness, substance abuse,
10	homelessness and related problems may engage in conduct that causes them to be cited for
11	a criminal offense; and
12	WHEREAS, These offenses adversely affect the quality of life for those who live and
13	work in the areas where the offenses occur; and
14	WHEREAS, When the persons who commit "Quality of Life" offenses come into contact
15	with the Court system, that system often provides no meaningful assistance to help them
16	resolve the problems that gave rise to the unlawful conduct; and
17	WHEREAS, Experience shows that Special Courts created to provide services to target
18	populations, such as Drug Courts, can be effective in helping persons address the root
19	causes of their behavior; and
20	WHEREAS, The establishment of a Special Court to hear "Quality of Life" offenses
21	could provide an effective means for the Court, those who engage in "Quality of Life" offenses,
22	and other participants in the criminal justice system to focus on the conditions that led to the
23	unlawful conduct and the availability of resources to assist this target population to change
24	those conditions; and
25	

1	WHEREAS, A Special Court established to hear "Quality of Life" offenses would focus
2	its attention on guiding defendants in a manner that allows them to avoid incarceration and
3	participate in rehabilitative programs; and
4	WHEREAS, A Special Court established to hear "Quality of Life" offenses would
5	consider certain violations of the Municipal Code and the California Penal Code that are
6	punishable as infractions, other than those related to traffic or Department of Motor Vehicle
7	offenses; and
8	WHEREAS, The offenses would include drinking in public, trespassing, aggressive
9	solicitation, peddling without a permit, camping in the park and unlawfully sleeping in the park;
10	and, in addition, any offenses hereafter enacted that would make it unlawful to urinate or
11	defecate in public; and
12	WHEREAS, Providing easily accessible information that tracks the number of citations
13	issued by the San Francisco Police Department for "Quality of Life" offenses and the outcome
14	of proceedings involving those citations would assist City departments and the public to
15	assess the effectiveness of the City's policies involving those who commit "Quality of Life"
16	offenses; and
17	WHEREAS, Information on the outcome of proceedings would include the number of
18	persons cited who paid bail, the number who failed to pay bail or appear in Court, the number
19	who appeared in Court, and the outcome of Court proceedings; and
20	WHEREAS, The City should make this information accessible whether or not the San
21	Francisco Superior Court establishes a Special Court to hear "Quality of Life" offenses; and
22	WHEREAS, The District Attorney is the appropriate officer to gather and publish this
23	information; and
24	WHEREAS, The San Francisco Superior Court has some of this information and can

make it available to the District Attorney; now, therefore, be it

1	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the San Francisco Superior Court to
2	establish a Special Court to hear "Quality of Life" offenses; and, be it
3	FURTHER RESOLVED, That Board urges the District Attorney to assign Assistant
4	District Attorneys to represent the People at the Special Court hearings or to delegate this
5	responsibility to the City Attorney's Office; and, be it
6	FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board urges the San Francisco Superior Court to
7	provide information to the District Attorney about the outcome of court proceedings involving
8	persons cited for "Quality of Life" offenses so that the District Attorney may include this
9	information in monthly reports made accessible to the public.
