3 the Mayor, are planning to submit directly to the voters.]

4 **Motion adding Rule 1.10 to the Rules of Order of the Board of Supervisors to provide**
5 **that Supervisors, and the Mayor, are urged to submit to the Board of Supervisors for**
6 **public hearing all proposed ballot measures that four or more Supervisors, or the**
7 **Mayor, are planning to submit directly to the voters, including general obligation or**
8 **revenue bond measures under sections 9.106 and 9.107 of the City Charter.**

14 MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does
15 hereby add Rule 1.10 to the Rules of Order of the Board of Supervisors to read as follows:

16 1.10. Public Hearings on Ballot Measures to be Submitted to the Voters by Four or More
17 Supervisors or the Mayor. City Charter sections 2.113 and 3.100 provide that four or more members
18 of the Board of Supervisors, and the Mayor, may submit directly to the voters declarations of policy,
19 and any matter which the Board of Supervisors is empowered to pass, including general obligation or
20 revenue bond measures under sections 9.106 and 9.107 of the City Charter. Supervisors, and the
21 Mayor, are urged to introduce any such proposed measure at the Board of Supervisors no later than 45
22 days before the deadline for the submission of the measure to the Director of Elections. The Board of
23 Supervisors shall hold a hearing on the measure no later than 30 days before the deadline for
24 submission of the measure to the Director of Elections and in no event later than 30 days before the
25 deadline for submission of the measure to the Director of Elections. The sponsors of a measure may
amend the measure at or after the initial hearing, provided that any such amendment must be submitted

1 to the Board of Supervisors, and the Board of Supervisors shall hold a hearing on the amended
2 measure, no later than 14 days before the deadline for submission of the measure to the Director of
3 Elections. Failure of the Board of Supervisors to hold any hearing required under this section shall not
4 preclude the sponsors from submitting the measure to the Director of Elections for submission to the
5 voters.
