

1 [Rule amendment clarifying the deadline for introducing legislation.]

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3 **Motion amending Rule 2.8 of the Rules of Order of the Board of Supervisors of the City**
4 **and County of San Francisco to clarify that in order for Supervisors and the Mayor to**
5 **introduce legislation at a Board of Supervisors meeting, the original and four copies of**
6 **the legislation must be received by the Clerk of the Board by the adjournment of the**
7 **Board meeting.**

13 MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco
14 hereby amends Rule 2.8 of the Rules of Order of the Board, to read as follows:

15 Rules 2.8 Legislative Introduction. Supervisors and the Mayor may introduce
16 measures and other matters a) during the portion of the Board meeting designated Roll Call
17 for Introduction or b) at any time by presenting them to the Clerk of the Board, with the
18 signature of the Supervisor(s), or the Mayor, or their designee attached. The original and four
19 copies of proposed legislation sponsored by a Supervisor, or the Mayor, shall be delivered to the Clerk
20 of the Board (with required electronic filing also occurring in a timely manner) by the adjournment of a
21 Board meeting in order to be considered introduced at that meeting. Proposed legislation delivered to
22 the Clerk of the Board by a sponsoring Supervisor, or the Mayor, after the adjournment of any Board
23 meeting shall be referred to the next available Board meeting for introduction. (This Rule does not
24 apply to resolutions and motions presented to the Clerk and received by a Wednesday noon deadline
25 for inclusion on the Adoption Without Committee Reference portion of the Agenda for the next
available Board meeting. These resolutions and motions are governed by Rule 3.11). Department

1 heads, with the specific or blanket approval of the Mayor, may submit proposed legislation to
2 the Clerk of the Board, in which case titles of the legislation will be printed at the rear of the
3 next available agenda and introduced by the President.

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
