3 Ordinance amending the Public Works Code, Article 15, by amending Section 724.1 to
4 modify monthly fees for temporary street occupancy for construction and daily fees for
5 temporary street occupancy unrelated to construction; and making environmental
6 findings.

10 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

11 Section 1. The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in
12 this Ordinance are in compliance with the California Environmental Quality Act (California
13 Public Resources Code Sections 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk
14 of the Board of Supervisors in File No. 110709 and is incorporated herein by
15 reference.

16 Section 2. The San Francisco Public Works Code is hereby amended by amending
17 Section 724.1 to read as follows:

18 **SEC. 724.1. TEMPORARY OCCUPANCY OF STREET-FEES TO BE PAID.**

19 (a) No permit shall be issued to a private or public entity for the temporary
20 occupancy of the street for building construction operations unless a fee and public right-of-
21 way occupancy assessment are paid. The fee shall be ~~\$14.26~~15.42, per month, per 20 linear
22 feet, or fraction thereof, occupied as measured parallel with the face of curb. In addition to the
23 fee, the permit applicant shall pay a public right-of-way occupancy assessment of
24 ~~\$72.74~~100.00, per month, per 20 linear feet, or fraction thereof, occupied as measured parallel
25 with the face of curb. For purposes of calculating fees and assessment costs, the Department

1 shall use one-month increments even though the permittee may occupy for less than a one-
2 month term.

3 (b) For temporary street space occupancy for any purpose other than a building
4 construction operation, the fee shall be ~~\$53,2856.76~~ per day with no assessment cost. Unless
5 specified otherwise, such occupation is subject to all provisions of Sections 724 et seq.

6 (c) Nonprofit organizations with tax exempt status under the Internal Revenue Code
7 shall be exempt from payment of the fee where the street occupancy is necessary for the
8 development of low and moderate income housing as defined by the United States
9 Department of Housing and Urban Development.

10 (d) Refund. If a permittee elects to relinquish all or a portion of the occupied street
11 space prior to termination of the permit, the permittee may seek a refund of fees and
12 occupancy assessment from the Department. There shall be no fee charged for a refund
13 request. Refunds shall be issued based only on one-month increments.


14 (e) Fee and Assessment Review. Beginning with fiscal year ~~2008-2009~~2012-2013,
15 the permit fee and street occupancy assessment set forth in this Section may be adjusted
16 each year, without further action by the Board of Supervisors, to reflect changes in the
17 relevant Consumer Price Index, as determined by the Controller. No later than April 15th of
18 each year, the Director shall submit its current fee and occupancy assessment schedule to
19 the Controller, who shall apply the price index adjustment to produce a new fee schedule and
20 occupancy assessment for the following year. No later than May 15th of each year, the
21 Controller shall file a report with the Board of Supervisors reporting the new fee schedule and
22 occupancy assessment and certifying that: (a) the permit fees produce sufficient revenue to
23 support the costs of providing the services for which the permit fee is assessed, and (b) the
24 permit fees do not produce revenue which is significantly more than the costs of providing the
25

1 services for which each permit fee is assessed. Notwithstanding the above, the Board of
2 Supervisors, in its discretion, may modify the street occupancy assessment at any time.

3 (f) Additional Fees. In instances where administration of this permit program or
4 inspection of a street space occupancy is or will be unusually costly to the Department, the
5 Director, in his or her discretion, may require an applicant or permittee to pay any sum in
6 excess of the amounts charged above. This additional sum shall be sufficient to recover
7 actual costs incurred by the Department and shall be charged on a time and materials basis.
8 The Director also may charge for any time and materials costs incurred by other agencies,
9 boards, commissions, or departments of the City in connection with the administration or
10 inspection of the street space occupancy. Whenever additional fees are charged, the Director,
11 upon request of the applicant or permittee, shall provide in writing the basis for the additional
12 fees and an estimate of the additional fees.

LEGISLATIVE DIGEST

[Public Works Code Temporary Street Occupancy Fees]

Ordinance amending Public Works Code Section 724.1 to modify monthly fees for temporary street occupancy for construction and daily fees for temporary street occupancy unrelated to construction; and making environmental findings.

Existing Law

Public Works Code Sections 724 et seq. establish the regulatory permit process for temporary street space occupancy for construction or activities unrelated to construction. The current fees associated with these permits for construction purposes are: \$15.42 per month per 20 linear feet for permit processing and \$76.73 per month per 20 linear for public right-of-way occupancy. The current fee for non-construction related permits is \$56.76 daily. These fees represent the legislatively adopted fees plus permissible escalation since the last legislative amendments to this Code section.

Amendments to Current Law

This legislation would increase the public right-of-way occupancy fee related to temporary street space occupancy for construction from its current fiscal year 2010-2011 fee to \$100 per month per 20 linear feet. The Ordinance would amend the processing fees for construction related permits and for daily non-construction permits to reflect the fee amount charged in fiscal year 2010-2011. The legislation also would amend the permit fee escalation provisions so that the fees are recalculated beginning in fiscal year 2012-2013. The Ordinance would adopt environmental findings.

Dear Ms. Calvillo:

The proposed ordinance (File No. 110709) will increase the public right-of-way occupancy assessment fee, and the permit fees for temporary street occupancy. The the public right-of-way occupancy assessment, essentially rent, is not a cost recovering fee. We have done a survey of parking costs throughout San Francisco and found that the proposed \$100 per parking space per month is well below the cost to for a reserved parking space in private or city-owned off-street parking facilities, as well as below the cost of parking at a meter.

The increase in the permit fees for temporary street occupancy codify the FY 2011-12 adjustment based on the Consumer Price Index provided for in Section 724.1(e) of the San Francisco Public Works Code. Attached are copies of the FY 2011-12 Fee Cost Recovery Form (Budget Form 2c) that we submitted to the Mayor's Office in February. Similar forms are submitted every year to ensure our fees do not recover more than the cost of the services we provide.

Please let me know if there is any other information you require.
