4 **Resolution supporting the passage of the California Clean Water, Clean Air, Safe**
5 **Neighborhood Parks, and Coastal Protection Bond Act of 2002 and encouraging**
6 **California voters to approve this bond act on March 5, 2002.**

8 WHEREAS, California's state, regional, and local parks serve as recreational, social,
9 and cultural centers for California's communities, providing important venues for youth
10 enrichment and safety; community identity; protection of natural, cultural and historic sites,
11 parkland and open space; and tourism; and,

12 WHEREAS, In order to maintain a high quality of life for California's growing
13 population, a continuing investment in parks, recreation facilities, and in the protection of the
14 state's natural, cultural and historic resources is needed; and,

15 WHEREAS, Each generation of Californians has an obligation to good stewards of
16 those natural and community resources in order to pass them onto their children; and,

17 WHEREAS, California's citizens and visitors have increased their visits to state and
18 local parks for healing and strength, sense of community, freedom and peace during these
19 turbulent times; and,

20 WHEREAS, California is known for its incredible natural resources of open space,
21 parks, mountains, rivers, coastline, and forests that positively impact the state and local
22 economy; and,

23 WHEREAS, California is largely an urban state where it is projected the state's
24 population will continue to grow by 18 million by 2020; thereby placing more pressure on
25 existing parkland facilities; and,

1 WHEREAS, California's towns and cities need to expand their parks and recreational
2 facilities in their neighborhoods to accommodate the needs of their children, adults and
3 seniors; and,

4 WHEREAS, California' economy is dependent upon maintaining a high quality of life
5 that includes attractive and safe public park and recreation facilities and services; and,

6 WHEREAS, The California Clean Water, Clean Air, Safe Neighborhoods Parks, and
7 Coastal Protection Act of 2002, provides \$2.6 billion for state and local parks projects to
8 preserve California's natural heritage and allow urban areas to expand much needed
9 recreation facilities that serve children, youth, seniors, and families; now, therefore be it

10 RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors supports the passage of the California
11 Clean Water, Clean Air, Safe Neighborhood Parks, and Coastal Protection Bond Act of 2002,
12 and encourages California voters approve this bond act on March 5, 2002.
