APPOINTING TWO MEMBERS TO THE HAZARDOUS MATERIALS ADVISORY COMMITTEE; WAIVING RESIDENCY REQUIREMENT.

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does hereby appoint the hereinafter designated persons to serve as members of the Hazardous Materials Advisory Committee, pursuant to the provisions of Section 1105 of the San Francisco Municipal Code (Health Code) for the term specified:

Gary Floyd, succeeding himself, (Seat No. 8, Must represent neighborhood organization, for a new four-year term ending July 1, 2003;

Gerald Grey, succeeding himself, (Seat No.17, Must represent the Fire Department, for a new four-year term ending July 1, 2003;

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 1. The membership of the Hazardous Materials Advisory Committee has a goal to be representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.
- 2. Applicant Gerald Grey, a re-appointee, who is not a resident of San Francisco, is a person with experience that uniquely

qualifies him to serve on the Hazardous Materials Advisory Committee.

- 3. The Hazardous Materials Advisory Committee has attempted to fill the position, for which Gerald Grey was nominated, with an individual who is a City resident and who has the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Gerald Grey is qualified to serve on the Hazardous Materials Advisory Committee.
- 4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there is no other possible representative, who is a resident of San Francisco and who has the specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this applicant, and who is willing to serve on the Hazardous Materials Advisory Committee at this time; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement for Gerald Grey, as allowed in cases where no qualified City resident, willing to serve, can be found, pursuant to Section 4.101 of the City Charter that requires persons appointed to boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of Supervisors to be residents of the City and County of San Francisco.
