[Urging Mayor to Restore \$25 Million Reduction in the Department of Children, Youth and Their

Families' Program Funding for FY2024-2025 Through a Public-Private Campaign Drive

WHEREAS, As of May 9, 2024, San Francisco is projected to face a \$789.3 million 2-year deficit; and

WHEREAS, The Department of Children, Youth and Their Families (DCYF) is currently projecting a \$25 million deficit; and

WHEREAS, These reductions have already had a destabilizing effect and will significantly impact children and youth programs across the city; and

WHEREAS, Mayor Breed has previously led public-private partnerships such as "The Summer Together" initiative that was a collaboration between city departments and private contributors; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor understood that "The Summer Together" initiative, like other DCYF funding, provides support to the physical health, emotional well-being, and educational achievements of our city's young people, especially those who are low-income and from communities of color; and

WHEREAS, "The Summer Together" initiative provided free or low cost in-person experiences for children and youth and was generously supported by the Crankstart Foundation, which provided \$20 million in funding, which enhanced city funding; and

WHEREAS, Philanthropic funding can help bridge the gap in city funding during periods of budgetary reductions and help maintain critical funding for essential programs that working families, especially low income families, throughout San Francisco rely on; and

WHEREAS, The Mayor has been silent so far this year on her ability to fundraise for these reductions amongst corporations, private entities, and charitable giving organizations; and

WHEREAS, The executive leadership of DCYF does not need a waiver from the City's behested payments Ordinance since they only do grant making and do not issue permits and has the existing authority to accept private contributions today; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the San Francisco Board of Supervisors hereby urges the Mayor to restore \$25 million in DCYF funding through a public-private charitable campaign; and, be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors urges the Mayor and the appropriate departments to take all necessary actions including private, corporate or philanthropic contributions to fully restore the \$25 million in reductions to the DCYF funding over the next two fiscal years.
