THE SOURCES AND ELIGIBLE USES OF MONIES IN THE AFFORDABLE CHILD CARE FUND, TO ALLOW MONIES FROM THAT FUND TO BE USED TO FUND ANY REPORT(S) REQUIRED TO DEMONSTRATE THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN OFFICE AND HOTEL DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS AND CHILD CARE DEMAND AS DESCRIBED IN SAN FRANCISCO PLANNING CODE SECTION 314.4., TO PROVIDE FOR BOARD OF SUPERVISORS APPROVAL OF RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE USES OF THAT FUND, AND TO RENAME THAT FUND THE "CHILD CARE CAPITAL FUND" TO REFLECT THE AMENDED USES OF THAT FUND.

AMENDING SECTION 314.5 OF THE SAN FRANCISCO PLANNING CODE TO EXPAND

Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

SEC. 314.5. ((AFFORDABLE CHILD-CARE FUND)) CHILD CARE CAPITAL

Section 1. Section 314.5 of the San Francisco Planning Code is hereby amended by to read as follows:

FUND. There is hereby established a separate fund set aside for a special purpose called the ((Affordable Child Care Fund)) Child Care Capital Fund ("Fund"). All monies contributed pursuant to the provisions of this Section, and all other monies from the City's general fund or from contributions from third parties designated for the Fund shall be deposited in the Fund. For a period of three years from the date of final adoption of this ordinance, no more than ((At

1	least)) 25 percent of the money deposited in the Fund shall be paid
2	to providers operating child-care facilities subject to Sections
3	314.4(b)(1), (2), (3) and (5) to reduce the cost of providing
4	affordable child-care services to children from households of low
5	income as required in Section 314.4(i). The remaining monies
6	deposited in the Fund during such three-year period, and all monies
7	in the fund following expiration of such three-year period, shall be
8	used solely to increase and/or improve the supply of child-care
9	facilities affordable to households of low and moderate income;
10	except that monies from the fund may be used by the Director to fund
11	any report(s) required to demonstrate the relationship between office
12	and hotel development projects and child care demand as described in
13	San Francisco Planning Code Section 314.4. In the event that no
14	child-care facility is in operation under Sections 314.4(b)(1), (2),
15	(3) or (5) during ((the one-year)) such three-year period ((after the
16	money is deposited into the Fund)), the maximum of 25 percent of the
17	Fund reserved for households of low income shall be spent solely to
18	increase <u>and/or improve</u> the supply of child-care facilities
19	affordable to households of low and moderate income. The Fund shall
20	be administered by the Director, who shall adopt rules and
21	regulations governing the disposition of the Fund which are
22	consistent with this Section. <u>Such rules and regulations shall be</u>
23	subject to approval by resolution of the Board of Supervisors.
24	((Within one year after the effective date of this Section, the
25	Director shall publish in an official newspaper of general

circulation in San Francisco proposed rules and regulations and notice of a public hearing on such rules and regulations. The public hearing shall be held within 30 days, but not less than 10 days, from such notice. At the public hearing, the Director shall adopt final rules and regulations and submit the same to the Board of Supervisors forthwith. The Board of Supervisors shall hold a public hearing on the Director's final rules and regulations within 45 days of receipt from the Director, at which time the Board may amend such rules and regulations or adopt them in their entirety. Any further amendments to such rules and regulations shall be initiated by the Director and shall be adopted in accordance with the above procedure.))
