| 9 | WHEREAS, The activist career of Reverend (Rev.) Dr. Amos C. Brown began with his |
| 10 | youth involvement in the NAACP in segregated Mississippi; and |
| 11 | WHEREAS, Dr. Brown took part in the Freedom Rides and was one of eight students |
| 12 | of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. at Morehouse College; and |
| 13 | WHEREAS, Dr. Brown has led Third Baptist Church at the corner of Pierce Street and |
| 14 | McAllister Street since 1976 and has been a steadfast leader in the Western Addition |
| 15 | community; and |
| 16 | WHEREAS, Under Dr. Brown's leadership, Third Baptist Church stabilized the F.D |
| 17 | Haynes Gardens housing complex, established Friday Night Live and Back on Track youth |
| 18 | programs, and continues to serve seniors through community building and food for the needy; |

| 20 | WHEREAS, Dr. Brown's impact on the community and commitment to social justice |
| 21 | extended well beyond the walls of the church; and |
| 22 | WHEREAS, Dr. Brown has led the San Francisco chapter of the National Association |
| 23 | for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP), leading the fight for social justice and Black |
| 24 | empowerment in San Francisco; and |

1 WHEREAS, Dr. Brown led fundraising and resettlement efforts for over 3,000 refugees 2 from Ethiopia and Eritrea, including hosting refugees in his own home that would go on to 3 become integral parts of the Western Addition and San Francisco community; and 4 WHEREAS, Dr. Brown has served his city on the Board of Supervisors and the City 5 College Board of Trustees, his state as vice-chair of the California Reparations Task Force, 6 and the world as a delegate to the United Nations Conference on Race and Intolerance; and 7 WHEREAS, The Department of Public Works and the office of District 5 Supervisor 8 Bilal Mahmood is in receipt of a request from Third Baptist Church to rename two blocks of 9 Pierce Street between Fulton Street and Golden Gate Avenue in honor of Rev. Brown's 10 distinguished career; now, therefore, be it 11 RESOLVED, That in order to honor the historic contributions of Dr. Brown, there shall be an honorary naming of "Dr. Amos C.
