New Business

San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency

Presenter: Kathryn Angotti

AB 2043 (Boerner): Medi-Cal: nonmedical and nonemergency medical transportation.

Recommended Position: Support

This bill aims to ensure that public paratransit service operators are not unduly burdened by the costs of nonemergency medical transportation or nonmedical transportation. It mandates the State Department of Health Care Services to guarantee fair reimbursement for these services, allowing them to direct Medi-Cal managed care plans to reimburse public paratransit operators at fee-forservice rates. Additionally, the department must collaborate with these operators to understand their challenges and issue new guidelines by June 1, 2026, to ensure the fiscal burden is not unfairly placed on them. Implementation hinges on obtaining federal approvals and securing federal financial support.

San Francisco Municipal Transportation Agency

Presenter: Kathryn Angotti

AB 2583 (Berman): School and walk zones.

Recommended Position: Support

This bill aims to enhance safety in school zones by implementing new requirements on circulation elements to create walk zones, reduce speed limits in school zones, and shift school zones signage requirements. Specifically, the bill requires (1) cities to identify and establish school walk zones in their circulation element — walk zones are roadways and sidewalks within 1,000 feet in all directions of the boundary line of a school grounds, (2) a prima facie speed limit of 20 miles per hour would be established in school zones instead of 25 mph as currently required, and (3) local authorities will be given school zone signage options of "speed limit 20 when flashing" and the beacons are flashing, "when children are present, or stating specific hours.

SB 532 (Wiener): Parking payment zones.

Recommended Position: Support

SB 532 modernizes municipal parking payment requirements by allowing cities to institute pay-by-phone only zones subject to specified criteria, including robust signage requirements and the adoption of an accessible and equitable cash payment plan that allows for the alternate payment of cash that doesn't rely on traditional parking meters. In practice, this bill would allow cities to keep all their parking meters, while allowing them to offer a combination of parking meters and pay by mobile device parking spots, or they can offer parking zones that pay by mobile device only.

San Francisco Public Utilities Commission

Presenter: Rebecca Peacock

SB 1255 (Durazo): Public water systems: needs analysis: water rate assistance program.

Recommended Position: Support

This bill would require certain water systems to begin providing water rate assistance to eligible ratepayers, defined to mean a low-income residential ratepayer with an annual household income that is no greater than 200% of the federal poverty guideline level, on or before April 1, 2027. The bill would require a qualified system to automatically enroll an eligible ratepayer in the water rate assistance program if available information indicates that they are qualified to receive assistance and provide a water bill credit.

The bill would require a qualified system, on or before July 1, 2026, to provide an opportunity for each ratepayer to provide a voluntary contribution as part of the ratepayer's water bill to provide funding for the qualified system's water rate assistance program. The bill would require a qualified system to recommend a voluntary contribution amount on the bill of each ratepayer, other than an eligible ratepayer, at a level that will raise sufficient funding to provide a discount to eligible ratepayers, pay for the qualified system's administrative costs to implement the program, and establish a balancing account if the qualified system chooses to do so. The bill would require a qualified system to notify ratepayers of the voluntary contribution on the water bill and provide each ratepayer the option and method of opting out of the voluntary contribution, as specified.

Qualified systems with an existing water rate assistance program that meets minimum requirements of this bill are not required to comply but can collect voluntary contributions to supplement or expand the existing program. The bill would authorize a qualified system to use any state or federal funds that are available to support a ratepayer assistance program by offsetting or supplementing the funds collected from voluntary contributions.

Department of Public Health

SB 1230 (Rubio): Strengthen Tobacco Oversight Programs (STOP) and Seize Illegal Tobacco Products Act.

Recommended Position: Support

SB 1230 strengthens the enforcement of California's anti-tobacco laws by increasing the civil penalties for violations of the Stop Tobacco Access to Kids Enforcement Act. This bill also permits the California Department of Tax and Fee Administration (CDTFA) to seize flavored tobacco products/tobacco flavor enhancers at retail locations, which are currently prohibited under state law.

Public Comment: No public comment. Motion to Support SB 1230: Robyn Burke Seconded by: Hannah Kohanzadeh Approved: 7-0

Department of Technology

Presenter: Brian Roberts

AB 2797 (Ashby): Telephone corporations: carriers of last resort: tariffs. **Recommended Position: Oppose**

AB 2797 would allow AT&T and other carriers of last resort (COLRs) a fast-track method for relieving themselves of obligations to serve. The COLR rules were created by the California Public Utilities Commission (CPUC) in the late 1990's to ensure universal service while ushering in competition for telecommunications services. (AT&T is the state's largest COLR, but various smaller local phone companies are also COLRs.)

AB 2797 would establish a new regime where a COLR could be deemed relieved of its COLR obligations by notice to the CPUC demonstrating that there are at least two "alternative voice providers" that offer voice service in the area. The alternative provider could be a wireless provider and would not have to assume COLR responsibilities. The COLR seeking to be relieved of its obligations, would have to agree to certain customer notification, transition planning and digital equity planning obligations. However, these commitments would be selfexecuting, with no administrative review by the CPUC or opportunity for the public to comment. AB 2797 would not require or incentivize investment in modern telecommunications infrastructure at all. It would facilitate disinvestment in AT&Ts more economically challenging rural and low-income markets. The proposed contains no administrative review by the CPUC or public input of any kind.







Dear Planning Commissioners, I am a resident that lives across the street from the former Recology site on 7th Street where Amazon is proposing to build a major shipping

depot. I am deeply concerned about the impacts of this project on the health and safety of our growing community and neighborhood. **Please vote NO on the authorization of this project and consider the following concerns I am bringing to your attention.**

As a native San Franciscan, I implore and urge you to truly think about the negative impacts this project has on our thriving Mission Bay community. Our diverse community at 888 7th Street has many young families, children, elderly, and people of color who are considered low income in San Francisco (our building has BMR units). Our safety, wellbeing, and livelihood are at stake. How would you feel if you found out Amazon was building their warehouse directly across from your home? From your grandparents and loved ones?

Amazon warehouses will negatively impact our local community in the following areas (among many). And there are countless examples you can easily find online of how Amazon has threatened other residents and neighborhoods. We will also suffer the consequences if Amazon builds their warehouse next door.

Pollution & Noise - 20 freight trucks, 175 delivery vans, and 395 worker cars (x 3 shifts) every day with facilities operating 24 hours a day across the street from homes occupied by families, seniors, young children, and students. We inhale pollution from the Caltrains, and adding the Amazon fleet will dramatically worsen the issue. In addition, allowing Amazon to operate 24/7 will dramatically increase noise levels; our windows aren't soundproof enough to block noises from the trains that run from the early morning to late in the evening. Our daily quality of life will worsen with the increased pollution and noise.

• Safety & Traffic — the amount of traffic will make the area unsafe for pedestrians, bicyclists, seniors, and children. Not to mention, many of the surrounding streets only have stop signs and as a pedestrian, it has already been unsafe at times. My family was involved in a hit-and-run two blocks away and my husband was hit by a vehicle while riding his bike to work a block away. Incidents like these are going to increase tenfold with Amazon in the neighborhood. Moreover, traffic is already horrendous during game days and concerts at Chase and Oracle Park, and adding Amazon's daily fleet will significantly worsen the issues.



I am elderly & cannot walk very far. I need public transportation to help me access the library. I live in Oceanview on Minerva St near Orizaba. This is approximately 5 blocks *up the hill* from where you are considering putting the new branch library at Brotherhood Way & Orizaba. There is absolutely no public transportation that would be available to me or others in this part of Oceanview that would enable us to access the library.

If the library was to be put on Randolph St there is excellent public transport available (the M Oeanview) all through the Oceanview area. In my case I would only need to walk approximately 2 blocks to access it and I think that is the case for many others with mobility issues.

Public transportation to the Orizaba & Brotherhood Way site comes from Plymouth St & does not serve the Western half of the Oceanview neighborhood at all, but the M Oceanview serves all of Oceanview.

Please consider the older & disabled community when you are making the final decision about where to locate the library. Many of us, in Oceanview, need public transportation to help us access the library!

LIBRARY COMMISSION MEETING ON THE OCEANVIEW LIBRARY

Hello Supervisors,

On July 18, 2024 the Library Commission met and shared important news about the Oceanview Library. In a Rules Committee meeting, on June 18, 2024, Supervisor Safai again requested that the Oceanview Library be built exclusively at the 100 Orizaba Avenue location. This exclusive request for a construction location is highly irregular, especially when the site requested for development is in a Greenbelt, on an earthquake fault, in a historic stream bed, on a narrow street, on the perimeter of the Oceanview district, two blocks away from the M streetcar with a slope and on a busy thoroughfare making the location an "attractive nuisance" whereby children will be unnecessarily in danger.

Numerous Librarian Commissioners commented on their preference for the "mixed use" site of a library located on Randolph Street. At least one Commissioner commented that Supervisor Safai was interfering with the research of an ideal, safe location. Also, Library Commissioners wish to be free to decide the best location for this library free of interference. During the last full Board of Supervisor review of the the Oceanview Library site, Supervisor Safai complained that those against the 100 Orizaba Avenue location wanted this area to be "frozen in time". It seems Supervisor Safai has a desire to build more than a library here.

Presently, there is \$42.1 million available for the Oceanview Library. In the year 2019, a 20,000 sf. feet library at this location was estimated to cost \$47 million. Today, with inflation, the cost of the library has increased by as much as 75%. This makes the cost of the Oceanview Library today to be between \$65-\$94 million. One way of bringing the cost down is to reduce the size of the library from 20,000 to 10,000 sq. feet. This would still make the size of the Oceanview Library greater than most libraries in San Francisco. Originally, the Oceanview Library was going to be built as a regional library.

It was suggested that the City and the Pilgrim Community Church sign a Memo of Understanding (M.O.U.) to establish an assumption of an agreement. Although the Oceanview Library is not firmly decided to be located at 100 Orizaba Avenue today, it was estimated that should a library be built there, it would take until the year 2035 to be completed. The library built at 100 Orizaba Avenue is likely to be more expensive than being built at the Randolph Street site. One reason for this could be the numerous signal lights required to make this area safe.

I recently saw the article discussing a planned homeless camp crackdown in August - <u>https://sfstandard.com/2024/07/18/san-francisco-homeless-encampment-crackdown/</u>

I wanted to share my support for this measure and suggest an area of interest. I live at Kansas and 16th street and have been experiencing increasing levels of negative homeless interactions. While I sympathize with their struggles and wish for their recovery, this situation is starting to become threatening for my girlfriend.

It has gotten to the point she is unable to walk from our apartment to the Fitness SF Soma gym or anywhere in the area near our apartment and the design district. She has been followed home multiple times, spit towards, called obscenities and been threatened multiple times. In addition to this we are unable to sleep with our window open at night due to one specific individual who screams "f***** moron" at the top of her lungs for 30-60 seconds while walking by kansas st multiple times a day and night. I have also seen this individual charge at people near the whole foods loading dock.

I have discussed these issues with friends and considered calling the homeless hotline and the police but everyone in the city says if the homeless person is not still there then there is no point, and even if they are; nothing will get done as the DA will not prosecute unless someone is **severely** physically harmed.

Given these concerns **I would like to suggest the following areas to be focused on in this initiative:**

- The blocks from Vermont & 17th to San Bruno & Division here is where most of the homeless are walking to including the one that screams and threatens people at all hours of the day (I've seen her near an RV when walking to the gym). It is also where a large amount of run-down dangerous RVs are parked (specifically under the underpass)
- The blocks from Jackson Park to Vermont & Division this area has some amount of issues, it is typically where people follow my girlfriend home and has a few vehicles or groups that pull up after dark
- I am sure the above 2 large areas are not the only issues and hope that all of Potrero, Soma, and the design district are included in these plans as every resident of SF deserves a safe comfortable place to live.

I hope this campaign is effective in both cleaning up the streets and helping the homeless recover.

Thanks, Ian P.S. What do you recommend I can do about the screaming individual? Like I said she walks by on her way to the other areas so she is only in the area for 30 seconds and I don't know exactly where she goes.

Earlier today, my staff and I witnessed this disturbing event on the sidewalk outside of our business. Two individuals - a man and a woman- were lying on the sidewalk with their belongings, blocking passage. They refused to leave. Upon further observation, we realized they were fornicating.

What makes this particularly disturbing is that the woman appeared to be boderline non-verbal, in distress and clearly not able to take care of herself. For our City to give tacit approval to this type of activity in the name of protecting individual rights is criminal. This woman needs protection - not be be left to fend for herself on the streets.

It can be safely assumed the the sexual perpetrator was also living on the streets likely here illegally - riding a very expensive bicycle that is likely stolen and smoking up whatever is his drug of choice as his post-coital pleasure.

SFPD responded to our 911 call but by the time the officer arrived, the male had fled and the female was departing - trying to break into an RV that has been parked illegally on our block for months as she made her way down the block.

Please do not respond to this email with helpful suggestions as to who we may call if this happens again. This is our daily reality. Bottom line is that it should not be happening in the first place. The policies of this City protect this very behavior. It is wrong and shameful. We are all paying the price for the City's lenient policies. We are doing no favors to anyone - especially the vulnerable individuals on the streets.

Did I mention that we were also left to clean up the pile of drug paraphinalia and unsanitary belongings they left behind? Thank you.

An elderly man was killed in the crosswalk in the morning of January 31 at Fulton and Arguello. We all know that both Fulton and Arguello, like the rest of San Francisco's High Injury Network, are streets that have killed and injured before and will do so again. I'm writing to urge SFMTA to immediately implement improvements at the Fulton and Arguello intersection, create a safer and slower Fulton, and proactively prioritize safety-forward measures citywide.

The Fulton Street Safety and Transit Project failed to lower speeds, or introduce significant vehicle calming measures. While the project introduced bus bulbs, the other main safety measure was painted safety zones. The planned transit bulb-out at the north-west corner of Fulton and Arguello (which very well may have helped the pedestrian in this case) has yet to be installed, nearly four years after it was approved. Paint does not protect. Concrete, slower speeds, and narrower lanes do. Therefore:

We urge the Department of Public Works and SFMTA to prioritize the completion of the transitbulb-out on the north-west corner on Fulton and Arguello.

We know that speed kills. So let's lower the speed limit on Fulton from 30 to 25 mph between Arguello to the Great Highway. This matches the 25 mph limit east of Arguello. We know that this intersection is heavily used by cyclists and transit riders accessing stops on Fulton and Arguello. The intersection needs an automatic pedestrian cycle with a leading pedestrian interval accommodating a walking speed of 2.5 feet/second or less. Because other Fulton crossings are likewise crucial entrances to Golden Gate Park for people of all ages and abilities, let's make sure every signalized intersection on Fulton from Stanyan to the Great Highway has these same signal improvements. Lastly, please expedite the protected bike lanes project on Arguello Boulevard from Fulton to the Presidio.

These are basic safety features that will make Fulton, and access to Golden Gate Park, safer for all road users.

To our elected leaders: I also urge you to remember our neighbor who was killed as you weigh the costs and benefits of future Muni Forward, Active Community Plan, and Vision Zero Quick Build projects. For example, building a transit-only lane on Fulton would allow us to put both transit and safety first, by making the bus faster and more convenient, while discouraging dangerous speeding. And there will be other projects that arise, offering safety, transit, and economic benefits—making it easier for San Franciscans to shift more trips to sustainable modes of travel to meet our city's climate goals—at the cost of some parking. Please consider the lives that you will save as you approve these projects.

		I would welcome safety improvements in West Portal, but that is not what has been proposed by SFMTA. All of the proposals increase "conflict" and decrease safety on adjacent streets and intersections and put small businesses at risk (an ongoing problem with SFMTA). I urge you to pause to learn more, measure accurately, and then implement in fiscally responsible phases in West Portal. There is no evidence that any of the options presented thus far will improve safety or would have prevented the tragedy that occurred.	
		I urge the SFMTA Board to REJECT the upcoming SFMTA staff proposal for West Portal. A full assessment of all corridor safety issues and alternative options is required after Fall traffic patterns have stabilized with the return of L Taraval LRV service and school year resuming.	
		My concerns are significant:	
		1. SFMTA's "high-conflict" verbiage does not mean high-risk.	
		2. All options over-burden adjacent residential streets, create a problematic one-way street on	

Lenox (which has universal resident opposition), and increase congestion in intersections that already have a higher volume of traffic and accidents (per SFMTA):

o There are 10x the number of traffic accidents at Vicente/WP versus Ulloa/WP

o Predicts a 50-75% traffic increase on Wawona – a residential street

3. Shifting buses to streets may have once mitigated operational concerns, but it also DECREASED SAFETY and INCREASED "conflict" by requiring transferring MUNI riders to cross multiple intersections.

4. A bike share station in the tunnel area also increases "conflict."

5. It is fiscally irresponsible to implement a project in an intersection not included on the prioritized High Injury Network when the SFMTA is currently facing a \$12.7M deficit, and looking at a \$240M deficit by 2026. The Valencia Street bike lanes originally cost \$1.5M for eight blocks (more than 10% of the current deficit), and having to re-do that work will cost significantly more. Let's not make the same mistake in WP.

There are opportunities to make the area around West Portal Station less confusing. The scope of options so far is extreme, disruptive, potentially less safe, and more chaotic as it will overburden adjacent residential streets, where children play. SFMTA also proposes adding a commercial bike share station to the Tunnel entrance and is resistant to less dangerous nearby locations.

There are many things that can be done to make West Portal safer and easier to navigate. The community has repeatedly asked for safety-related improvements before, but those requests have been ignored by SFMTA Staff.

I ask the SFMTA Board to require a holistic approach predicated on valid data compiled after a comprehensive Fall traffic study and consideration of community and expert input. All modes of transportation, the needs of our merchants who are dependent on automotive transit, and the needs of 23% of the West Portal population who are seniors must be considered.

I appreciate the work the West Portal Welcome Committee has done representing the neighborhood and merchant corridor. Predicating their discussion on the original ill-conceived, confusing and potentially dangerous traffic reconfiguration option that is solely focused on the West Portal/Ulloa intersection does not take into consideration the impact, unintended consequences and more urgent vulnerabilities along the rest of the corridor and surrounding streets.

	Message:	Dear Supervisors.
		The ordinance put forth by Supervisor Chan amending the Administrative Code which would allow SFMTA to bypass important rules and best practices for entering into contracts is unconscionable.
		The rules set forth in the Administrative Code governing contracts include competitive bidding, the Environmental Code, equal benefits, local business enterprise utilization and other important safeguards against corruption, fraud, and waste. The provisions in the Administrative Code should not be waivable or optional; they exist to protect the taxpayer, local business, local talent and presumably the environment.
		Amending the Administrative Code is a drastic step towards granting an incompetent agency power they should not have. SFMTA simply is not an agency that can or should be trusted to enter into contracts without oversight or rules to guide the process and ensure best practice.
		We are all currently feeling the consequences of unprecedented fiscal irresponsibility by our City government with a deficit that is threatening the operations of almost every department in the city.

Now is not the time to allow an agency with a known track record for shoddy data and over-budget projects to enter into contracts with no accountability and fewer protections to the process.

This ordinance's built in expiration date of 3 years provides little comfort to taxpayers as SFMTA has a habit of making things that are "temporary" permanent. It would be better not to go down this path of AMENDING a code then to try to re-establish it in the future. Once SFMTA can ignore all sensible elements to negotiating and entering into a contract it is safe to say it will remain that way indefinitely.

The failure of SFMTA to achieve its Vision Zero goals has less to do with streamlining a contract process and everything to do with their poor planning, lack of interest in community feedback, and little understanding of the city streets and how they are used. Vision Zero requires more than knee-jerk reactions and piecemeal projects, and until competence and data replaces ideology and fiction, no amount of streamlining any process will bring us closer to achieving safer streets or the goals of vision zero.

I urge you to abandon this ordinance and require SFMTA to continue to respect and adhere to the very necessary protections in our Administrative Code. Taxpayers, small businesses, and local workers can no longer bear the brunt of SFMTA's unproductive and community damaging projects.

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Board of Supervisors,

I'm writing to urge you to reform San Francisco's Window Replacement Standards. This is long overdue.

My home was built in 1890 and is incredibly energy-inefficient. I pay exorbitant costs to heat my home nine months a year, and I know that most of the heat leaks out the windows. In addition, dirt comes in the windows because they are not tight. Thirdly, I can hear a lot of noise, including pedestrian conversations as well as car and bus noise, through my windows. I would like to replace all of my single-pane windows with double-paned, energy efficient windows.

While I appreciate the effort to preserve the historic homes that make San Francisco beautiful, there must be a way to compromise. We are a leading city of the world; we should have homes that are leading in energy efficiency.

Every San Francisco resident deserves windows that aren't leaky, are insulated to reduce heating bills, noise, and condensation, and reduce fossil fuel heating needs – at an affordable price.

But San Francisco's Window Replacement Standards unnecessarily raise the price to replace street-facing windows in many San Francisco homes. Exorbitant costs mean less window upgrades, meaning homeowners and renters are stuck with old, leaky windows that harm health, comfort, and the climate.

**Costlier for Homeowners: The standards increase the cost of replacing street-facing windows by 50-100%. 70% of San Francisco's occupied 350,000 homes were built in the 1960s or before.

**Costlier for Renters: Costlier window replacements are passed on in the form of higher rent. More likely, exorbitant costs means tenants are stuck with draftier interiors, and higher heating bills and carbon emissions. Over half of San Francisco's renters live in housing units built before 1970 in SF.

**Bad for the Climate: Residents burn more fossil fuels to heat their homes as older windows are more likely to be poorly sealed, leaky, and uninsulated single pane glass. 56% of occupied homes in San Francisco are heated with fossil fuels, mostly with natural gas.

**Bad for Health: Older single-pane windows are more likely to condense, leading to indoor mold. They're also more likely to leak, allowing heat or air-conditioned air to escape, and polluting particulates from nearby highways inside.

**Bad for Comfort: In addition to leaking air in-and out, older windows block less noise. This is increasingly important as San Francisco accommodates more housing.

Dear Supervisors:

I am writing to ask that you withdraw the Great Highway initiative from the November ballot by July 30, 2024 for the following reasons:

1) It includes no plans. Without that, no one knows what they're voting for.

2) If an EIR is needed, one hasn't been done regarding the dunes and vegetation, sand issues, the snowy plover habitat, traffic impacts, etc.

3) There has been little to no community input re concerns and ideas.

4) There have been little to no studies done on traffic impacts re traffic rerouting, congestion and spillover into neighborhoods.

5) Nothing has been mentioned about parking for park attendees nor any discussion of improving Muni service or other transportation services to and from the park.

6) The initiative says the GH can be closed within 180 days if it goes through. It takes time to develop effective traffic plans and to make traffic light and stop sign changes. If the GH gets closed with no plans and no prior workable traffic changes, that will result in major traffic routing problems for all impacted neighborhoods.

If the GH gets closed without any plans, that may result in blight for the area.

Additionally, a D4 resident has reported seeing more homeless encampments and drug use when the GH is closed, including someone coming into her yard facing the GH and her having to call the police. Her concern is that a prematurely-closed GH will encourage more homeless encampments and drug use, resulting in people not feeling safe in the neighborhood nor in coming to the area.

A recent presentation by a neighborhood group alleged that the initiative has made alterations in the original ordinance:

Sec 2.c.2 removes language asking the SFMTA to make data reports. Traffic data is needed!

Sec 2.c.4 deletes some protection language apparently resulting in no voice given to residents in D1 and D4. Those mostly closely impacted need to be heard.

For all these reasons, and I'm sure there are more, this initiative needs to be

withdrawn.

If the GH is to become a park, realistic steps can begin to happen, such as:

1) Establish an organizing group/process to begin to collect info, ideas and concerns from all involved/concerned.

2) Is an EIR required, and if so, does this need to be done first? For the dunes/vegetation, sand management, snowy plover, traffic impacts, etc.

3) Hold meetings/get input from D1 and D4 residents and merchants and from the broader community regarding their ideas and concerns.

4) Have a thorough discussion on traffic reroutes and timelines for making traffic light and stop sign changes. Discuss parking and ways to improve public transportation to and from the park.

5) Involve designers in helping to come up with some plans based on community input. Examine budget costs. Does SF have the budget for the plans, including transportation changes?

Make the best plans available for community evaluation, which will be quite varied, regarding general design and use of the park and its maintenance, family involvement, entertainment plans and venues, recreational activities involving other recreational users while also designing for safety in interacting with the general public, food availability, disability access, etc.

6) Address concerns that the closed-off area will attract homeless encampments and drug users, making the area unsafe for the neighborhood and visitors to the area. Figure out a timeline for GH closure and make plans to prevent such attractive nuisance occurrence.

As a result of going through a thorough process PRIOR to a GH park initiative going to the ballot, people's concerns and best ideas will have been heard, worked on and selected for implementation, resulting in the public being a lot more accepting of the Great Highway park that they helped create!

Hello Mayor Breed, District Supervisors, SFCTA and SFMTA

The first week of the Mayor's compromise plan under which the Great Highway is open to cars Monday through Friday until noon is now behind us. Aside from a couple of Critical Mass-like stunts by the no-compromise zealots, and a few issues with signage and the timing of the gate closures, the new arrangement seemed to go smoothly and to accommodate all interests.

However, the point of the compromise arrangement is to allow drivers to use the Highway during the week, when they are taking kids to school, traveling to and from jobs, etc. There seems to be little rhyme or reason to closing the Highway so early on Fridays, forcing people who are trying to get home to start their weekends to be caught up in the traffic mess that the closed Highway brings. Friday also tends to be "getaway" day, with many folks trying to leave town (including many who want the Highway closed to drivers), and cutting off this access route makes little sense. Indeed, the traffic conditions reverted to "horrendous" this first Friday once the Great Highway was closed, just as the work week was winding down.

That said, I ask that you adjust the closure hours so that the Great Highway is available to drivers through Friday's evening commute. Keep in mind, once it's dark, no one is using it but vehicles. Rather than closing it at noon on Fridays, let the closure wait until 6:00 a.m. on Saturday, consistent with Monday's 6:00 a.m. reopening.

By the rules of the Health Service System itself, only a Board member who originally approved the decision to approve United Health can propose a resolution to overturn it. This did not happen, because no member approving UHC put forth the resolution to reject United Health in favor of Blue Shield.

Further, Dr. Fiona Wilson, new to the Board, replaced Dr.Steven Folansbee who was fired the weekend before the vote of reversal was taken.

This is dirty politics.

The justification is saving the city money for the next fiscal year.

This is based on predictions, not actual economic performance of city for the following year. The city could have a robust, flourishing recovery next year, but patients of Blue Shield will be saddled with an inferior plan.

A plan of high quality is needed to serve retired employees with severe health problems. Many have served San Francisco at the risk, if not the sacrifice, of their lives.

This is an ageist insult to public servants and reflects ill on those approving the decision to accept Blue Shield.

Harvey Rose, the budget analyst, has noted that Blue Shield can increase its cost, subverting the original intent of the city saving money.

The decision to approve Blue Shield is not only mean, it is stupid.

We need to keep United Health Care.

Please vote no on Item 33.
