

1 [To determine the most effective way to reduce risk behaviors that lead to exposure to HIV
2 and increase adherence to remedial treatment after exposure to HIV.]

4 **Resolution authorizing the San Francisco Department of Public Health (SFDPH) to**
5 **enter retroactively into an agreement in the amount of \$162,320.48 with The Regents of**
6 **the University of California San Francisco (UCRSF), for the “Behavioral, Basic and**
7 **Clinical Studies of the Post-Exposure Prophylaxis (PEP)” project for the period of**
8 **September 1, 2001 to August 31, 2002.**

10 WHEREAS, UCRSF has received funds from the National Institutes of Health for the
11 conduct of a program titled “Behavioral, Basic and Clinical Studies of Post-Exposure
12 Prophylaxis (PEP)” and,

13 WHEREAS, UCRSF has requested that SFDPH enter into a subcontract agreement to
14 participate in this project; and,

15 WHEREAS, On April 16, 2001, the San Francisco Board of Supervisors in Resolution
16 No. 296-01 authorized SFDPH to enter into an agreement in the amount of \$124,747.56 with
17 UCRSF for year one of this subcontract, for the period of September 30, 2000 to August 31,
18 2001; and

19 WHEREAS, UCRSF, in Attachment A incorporated by reference into this subcontract,
20 recommends reimbursement of the SFDPH in the amount of \$162,320.48 for year two of this
21 subcontract; and

22 WHEREAS, As a condition of receiving the funds UCRSF requires SFDPH to enter into
23 a subcontract (The “Agreement”), a copy of which is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
24 Supervisors in File No. 020103, which is hereby declared to be a part of this resolution as
25 if set forth fully herein; and,

1 WHEREAS, The subcontract budget includes provision for indirect costs in the amount
2 of \$17,391.48; now, therefore, be it

3 RESOLVED, That SFDPH is hereby authorized to enter retroactively into a subcontract
4 agreement in the amount of \$162,320.48 for year two of this subcontract with UCRSF, the
5 primary contractor; and, be it

6 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Director of Health is authorized to enter into the
7 Agreement on behalf of the City.

8 FURTHER RESOLVED, That the 1.0 FTE Nurse Practitioner position shall be
9 designated as a grant "G" funded position and the authorization for this position shall
10 terminate when the grant terminates.




