8 emergency actions during the shutdown to protect working families, including temporary  
9 funding for Medicaid, SNAP, childcare, and other essential programs, as well as ensuring  
10 back pay and job protection for state employees who are furloughed or required to work  
11 without pay, and providing transparent, real-time reporting on program disruptions and those  
12 affected; and

13 WHEREAS, The “One Beautiful Bill Act” has created a growing health care crisis by  
14 cutting more than \$900,000,000,000 in federal Medicaid funding and failing to extend the  
15 Affordable Care Act (ACA) premium tax credits, resulting in health care cost increases,  
16 hospital closures, loss of coverage for approximately 15,000,000 people, and the loss of more  
17 than 600,000 health care jobs; and

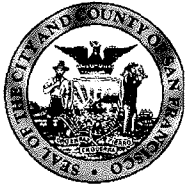
18 WHEREAS, Health insurers will begin announcing next year’s ACA marketplace  
19 premiums in October, which are expected to increase by 114 percent for 22,000,000 people if  
20 premium tax credits are not extended in time; and

21 WHEREAS, On October 27, 2025, the San Francisco Labor Council passed a  
22 Resolution urging federal leaders to fund the government, address the health care crisis, and  
23 put working people first; now, therefore, be it
