

SMART TRASH CANS PILOT PROGRAM



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OEWD Process

- The Smart Trash Cans pilot program is administered by Office of Economic and Workforce Development (OEWD) and the Mayor's Fix It Team
- OEWD was funded in FY 18-19 and FY 19-20 to implement the pilot program
- OEWD issued a competitive RFP for Community Based Organizations to respond
- The Mayor's Fix It Team coordinates between CBO's participating in the program, smart trash can company, Recology and related City Departments
- OEWD administers the agreement between the City and CBO for the smart trash units

Preliminary Findings

Location	Finding
1007 Market Street (at 6 th)	50% reduction in calls for overflowing trash cans
1061 Market Street (between 6 th and 7 th)	Eliminated all calls for overflowing trash cans
1095 Market Street (at 7 ^{th)}	67% reduction in calls for overflowing trash cans
Intersection of Grant and Vallejo	Eliminated all calls for overflowing trash cans
Intersection of Union and Columbus	40% reduction in calls for overflowing trash cans
Tenderloin CBD Bigbellies	 19,650 gallons of trash collected over 17 months Average volume is 231 gallons/month per Bigbelly Highest performing is Turk and Jones location: 8,850 gallons over 17 months and average of 520 gallons of trash per month



Observations and Impact

- CBO partner with the capacity to participate in the pilot project is important
- Smart Trash Can leases only come in certain durations, with two years being the minimum – one time funding allocations place the ongoing costs on the CBO
- CBO stewardship is key to their success
- OEWD has invited a few of our CBO partners to speak about the implementation of Smart Trash Can units in their neighborhoods and their impact
