WHEREAS, Twenty-nine percent of all Californians who died by violence in 1996 were young people under the age of twenty.

WHEREAS, Recognizing the seriousness of this problem will help stress the need for safeguarding our children by making our streets and neighborhoods safer; and,

WHEREAS, In 1997, the State Assembly of California formally declared the fourth Friday of April "Children's Memorial Day" throughout the state to preserve the memory of children who have died as a result of violence; and,

WHEREAS, The Child Welfare League of America is lobbying Congress to adopt the day nationally; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco officially declare the fourth Friday of April as Children's Memorial Day throughout the city in memory of children whose lives were cut short by senseless acts of violence.
