3	Resolution extending the Juvenile Justice Advisory Committee's term of operation for
4	an additional six months.
5	
6	WHEREAS, On August 13, 2001, the Board of Supervisors passed resolution number
7	011153 establishing a Juvenile Justice Advisory Committee (JJAC); and,
8	WHEREAS, The JJAC is a three member committee made up of one member with at
9	least ten years experience working with at risk youth, one member with an advance degree in
10	law, criminal justice, public administration, social work, or related field, and at least five years
11	experience working as a juvenile justice consultant or administrator, and one member with an
12	advance degree in law, criminal justice, public administration, social work, or related field, and
13	experience in working with young, at-risk women of color; and,
14	WHEREAS, The JJAC receives research and administrative assistance from the Office
15	of Legislative Analyst; and,
16	WHEREAS, The JJAC will review and make recommendations to the Board of
17	Supervisors on possible legislative and budgetary actions regarding a wide array of issues
18	affecting young people involved in the juvenile justice system; and,
19	WHEREAS, The resolution establishing the JJAC specified a sunset date of
20	September 1, 2002; and,
21	WHEREAS, Due to delays in appointing members to the JJAC, the committee has had
22	the opportunity to meet for only 6 months and currently has research and information
23	requests pending before the Office of Legislative Analyst which will be part of the committee's
24	final recommendations to the Board of Supervisors; now, therefore, be it

1	RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors extends the Juvenile Justice Advisory
2	Committee's term of operation for an additional 6 months.
