4 **Motion appointing Lindsay LaSalle, Janet Ector, Teresa Lynn Friend (residency**
5 **requirement waived), Pedro Vidal Flores, Curtis Bradford, Porsha Dixon, Louie**
6 **Hammonds, Max Young, and Thomas Wolf, for indefinite terms, to the Street-Level**
7 **Drug Dealing Task Force.**

9 MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco does
10 hereby appoint the hereinafter designated persons to serve as members of the Street-Level
11 Drug Dealing Task Force, pursuant to the provisions of Administrative Code, Chapter 5,
12 Article XXII, for the terms specified:

13 Lindsay LaSalle, seat 1, new appointment, must be held by a person with experience
14 or expertise relevant to multifaceted approaches to addressing harms related to street-level
15 drug dealing, and shall have a background in law enforcement, reentry, public health, harm
16 reduction, community-based accountability, and/or restorative justice, for an indefinite term;

17 Janet Ector, seat 2, new appointment, must be held by a person with experience or
18 expertise relevant to multifaceted approaches to addressing harms related to street-level drug
19 dealing, and shall have a background in law enforcement, reentry, public health, harm
20 reduction, community-based accountability, and/or restorative justice, for an indefinite term;

21 Teresa Lynn Friend (residency requirement waived), seat 3, new appointment, must be
22 held by a person with experience or expertise relevant to multifaceted approaches to
23 addressing harms related to street-level drug dealing, and shall have a background in law
24 enforcement, reentry, public health, harm reduction, community-based accountability, and/or
25 restorative justice, for an indefinite term;

1 Pedro Vidal Flores, seat 4, new appointment, must be held by a person who is directly
2 impacted by the harms related to street-level drug dealing, and who is a person at-risk for
3 experiencing crime, formerly incarcerated people or their family members, individuals with
4 past experiences of substance addiction, or members of other vulnerable communities, for an
5 indefinite term;

6 Curtis Bradford, seat 5, new appointment, must be held by a person who is directly
7 impacted by the harms related to street-level drug dealing, and who is a person at-risk for
8 experiencing crime, formerly incarcerated people or their family members, individuals with
9 past experiences of substance addiction, or members of other vulnerable communities, for an
10 indefinite term;

11 Porsha Dixson, seat 6, new appointment, must be held by a person who is directly
12 impacted by the harms related to street-level drug dealing and who is a person at-risk for
13 experiencing crime, a formerly incarcerated person or their family members, individuals with
14 past experience of substance addiction, or members of other vulnerable communities, for an
15 indefinite term;

16 Louie Hammonds, seat 7, new appointment, must be held by a person with experience
17 relevant to street-level drug dealing, including people with experience as or with former street-
18 level drug distributors, economics of street-level drug distribution, and/or local drug distribution
19 practices, for an indefinite term;

20 Max Young, seat 8, new appointment, must be held by a person who is directly
21 impacted by the harms related to street-level drug dealing in the neighborhoods of the
22 Tenderloin, Mid-Market, South of Market, and/or Civic Center, and who is a resident or small
23 business owner in those neighborhoods, for an indefinite term;

24 Thomas Wolf, seat 9, new appointment, must be held by a person who is directly
25 impacted by the harms related to street-level drug dealing in the neighborhoods of the

1 Tenderloin, Mid-Market, South of Market, and/or Civic Center, and who is a resident or small
2 business owner in those neighborhoods, for an indefinite term; and, be it

3 FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors makes the following findings:

- 4 1. The membership of the Street-Level Drug Dealing Task Force has a goal to be
5 representative of the diversity of the City and County of San Francisco.
- 6 2. Applicant Teresa Lynn Friend, who is not a resident of San Francisco, is a person with
7 experience that uniquely qualifies them to serve on the Street-Level Drug Dealing Task
8 Force.
- 9 3. The Street-Level Drug Dealing Task Force has attempted to fill the position, for which
10 Teresa Lynn Friend was nominated, with an individual who is City a resident and who
11 has the specific experience, skills, and qualifications, but has been unable to do so at
12 this time. The Rules Committee has certified that Teresa Lynn Friend, is qualified to
13 serve on the Street-Level Drug Dealing Task Force.
- 14 4. After exercising due diligence, the Board of Supervisors concludes that there is no
15 other possible representative, who is a resident of San Francisco, and who has the
16 specific experience, skills, or qualifications possessed by this applicant, and who is
17 willing to serve on the Street-Level Drug Dealing Task Force at this time; and, be it

18 FURTHER MOVED, That the Board of Supervisors waives the residency requirement
19 for Teresa Lynn Friend, as allowed in cases where no qualified City resident, willing to serve,
20 can be found, pursuant to Charter, Section 4.101(a)(2), that requires person(s) appointed to
21 boards, commissions, and advisory bodies established by legislative act of the Board of
22 Supervisors to be resident(s) of the City and County of San Francisco.
