3 **Resolution declaring the results of the June 5, 2018, Consolidated Statewide Direct**

6 WHEREAS, A Consolidated Statewide Direct Primary Election was conducted in the  
7 City and County of San Francisco on Tuesday, June 5, 2018, which placed before the  
8 electorate candidates for Mayor, Member of the San Francisco Board of Supervisors, and San  
9 Francisco Superior Court; and local ballot measures; and

10 WHEREAS, John Arntz, the Director of Elections for the City and County of San  
11 Francisco, has certified the results of the Consolidated Statewide Direct Primary Election, a

3. Ordinances

The following Ordinances received an affirmative vote of more than a majority of the votes cast thereon and were therefore passed by the voters:

PROPOSITION E: Prohibiting Tobacco Retailers from Selling Flavored Tobacco Products
