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3 **Ordinance amending the Park Code to reduce the number of seats on the Parks,**  
 4 **Recreation, and Open Space Advisory Committee (PROSAC), to provide for alternate**  
 5 **members, and to allow members to serve for more than four consecutive terms.**

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12 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

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14 Section 1. Article 13 of the Park Code is hereby amended by revising Section 13.01, to  
 15 read as follows:

16 **SEC. 13.01. CITIZENS' ADVISORY COMMITTEE.**

17 (a) **Membership.** *Effective September 1, 2023, the ~~There is hereby established a~~ Park,*  
 18 *Recreation and Open Space Advisory Committee ("Committee") shall be comprised of*  
 19 *~~12~~twenty-three members. ~~Eleven~~Twenty-two members shall be appointed by the members of the  
 20 *Board of Supervisors and approved by the full Board, with one member appointed by each*  
 21 *Supervisor from ~~their~~his or her supervisory district; and each Supervisor shall also appoint from*  
 22 *their supervisory district a specific alternate for the regular voting member, subject to approval by*  
 23 *the full Board. The alternates shall not be seated on the Committee, but if a regular voting member is*  
 24 *unavailable to attend then that regular voting member's specific alternate shall be seated and shall act*  
 25 *in the place of the regular voting member. The Mayor shall appoint one member of the Committee.**

1 who shall be a City resident. The Committee members shall have relevant experience with ~~and one~~  
2 ~~member appointed by each Supervisor from a list, maintained by the Recreation and Park Commission~~  
3 ~~("Commission") of individuals nominated by organizations having as a primary focus park,~~  
4 environmental, recreational, cultural, sports, youth or senior citizen issues. ~~Four of the members~~  
5 ~~chosen from the list maintained by the Commission shall be individuals nominated by an environmental~~  
6 ~~organization. If the system of district elections set forth in Charter Section 13.110 is discontinued, each~~  
7 ~~Supervisor shall appoint one member of the Committee from the list maintained by the Commission and~~  
8 ~~one member without restriction. One member of the Committee shall be appointed by the Mayor.~~

9 (b) **Terms.** The Committee members shall serve at the pleasure of their appointing  
10 authority for terms of two years, ~~at the will of the appointing authority, except that at the first~~  
11 ~~meeting of the Committee the General Manager of the Recreation and Park Department~~  
12 ~~("Department") shall, by lot, designate twelve members to serve terms of one year. Thereafter, all~~  
13 ~~members shall be appointed to two-year terms and no member shall serve more than four consecutive~~  
14 ~~terms.~~

15 (c) **Transition Period.** Prior to September 1, 2023, the Committee shall adopt a transition  
16 roster that identifies which of the current Board-appointed members shall serve as regular voting  
17 members versus as alternates. Where there are already two members appointed by the same  
18 Supervisor, those members shall attempt to reach agreement as to which of them shall be the regular  
19 voting member and which of them shall be the alternate, before September 1, 2023, subject to approval  
20 of the Committee; but if they do not agree, then the Committee may designate their assignments by lot.  
21 The Committee's adoption of a transition roster shall not impact the authority of the Mayor or Board of  
22 Supervisors to fill vacancies or reassign which members serve as regular voting members and  
23 alternates. From the effective date of Proposition C, which appeared on the March 7, 2000 ballot and  
24 until January 31, 2001, the Open Space Advisory Committee created by former Charter Section 16.107  
25 shall serve as the Committee created in section (a) above. During this transition period the Open Space
