1 [Zoning -- Edgehill Mountain Slope Protection Area]

CREATING THE EDGEHILL MOUNTAIN SLOPE PROTECTION AREA, WHICH IS
GENERALLY BOUNDED BY GARCIA AVENUE, VASQUEZ AVENUE, KENSINGTON WAY,
AND ULLOA STREET AND TRAVERSED BY EDGEHILL WAY; IMPOSING AN ORDER
PROHIBITING ACTION ON APPLICATIONS FOR PERMITS OR OTHER LAND USE
ENTITLEMENTS, SUBJECT TO SPECIFIC EXEMPTIONS, IN THE EDGEHILL MOUNTAIN
SLOPE PROTECTION AREA WHILE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS CONSIDERS

ADOPTION OF INTERIM ZONING CONTROLS TO PROTECT THE EDGEHILL MOUNTAIN SLOPE PROTECTION AREA; AND MAKING A FINDING OF CONSISTENCY WITH THE PRIORITY POLICIES OF PLANNING CODE SECTION 101.1.

WHEREAS, On or about January 5, 1997, a section of Edgehill Way and an adjacent retaining wall began to creep downhill, endangering property on and adjacent to the slide area; and,

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors is authorized by Section 306.7 of the Planning Code to impose interim zoning controls in order to protect the public health, safety, peace, and general welfare; and,

WHEREAS, Since the significant slide activity in 1997, there is continued concern about slope stability problems along the Edgehill Way slide area and other parts of Edgehill Mountain such that the Board of Supervisors is considering adoption of a temporary moratorium on certain permit applications in areas and for properties which are susceptible to potential slide damage or which may cause further destabilization, until permanent controls can be drafted, reviewed, and considered for adoption; and,

WHEREAS, Such proposed interim zoning controls are on file with the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors in File Number 990218; and,

WHEREAS, The area subject to the proposed temporary moratorium shall be referred to as the "Edgehill Mountain Slope Protection Area," which is generally bounded by Garcia Avenue, Vasquez Avenue, Kensington Way, and Ulloa Street and traversed by Edgehill Way; and,

WHEREAS, Pursuant to Section 306.7(b) of the Planning Code, the Board of Supervisors, at any time after the first noticed hearing on interim controls may, by resolution, issue an order directing the Zoning Administrator, the Director of the Department of Building Inspection, the Board of Appeals, and other permit-issuing and permit-approving agencies of the City to suspend action on applications which propose a use prohibited by the proposed interim controls pending final action on the controls, with certain provisos; and

WHEREAS, A resolution imposing an order that suspends action on permit applications for certain projects in the proposed Edgehill Mountain Slope Protection Area is necessary to protect properties on or adjacent to Edgehill Mountain from adverse impacts from development while the Board of Supervisors considers the adoption of the proposed interim controls for that area, so that the purposes of the interim controls are not undermined during the period when their adoption is under consideration; and,

WHEREAS, The Board of Supervisors has determined that the adoption of such a resolution suspending action on certain permits will promote the public interest in preserving and protecting the delicate environmental and geologic features of the Edgehill Mountain Slope Protection Area; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, That the Board of Supervisors, for purposes of this resolution ordering the suspension of certain permit-related actions, hereby designates the Edgehill Mountain Slope Protection Area, which is generally bounded by Garcia Avenue, Vasquez Avenue, Kensington Way, and Ulloa Street and traversed by Edgehill Way. The Edgehill Mountain ///

Slope Protection Area is comprised of the following Assessor's Block Numbers: 2875, 2876, 2923, 2934, 2935, 2936A, and 2936B; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Zoning Administrator, the Director of the Department of Building Inspection, the Board of Appeals, and any other permit-issuing and permitapproving agencies of the City are hereby ordered to suspend action on applications for any demolition permit, grading permit, site permit, building permit, conditional use authorization, or other land use entitlement for property located in the Edgehill Mountain Slope Protection Area, if such permits or other land use entitlements would authorize or might contribute to new construction, alteration of land forms, removal of vegetation, alteration of natural drainage patterns, soil erosion, or increased surface runoff, consistent with the purposes of proposed interim zoning controls in File Number 990218 of the Clerk of the Board of Supervisors; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the following projects or activities are exempt from this resolution:

- (a) maintenance, repair, or other activity involving the interior, exterior, or both, of any legally existing structure or use, so long as such maintenance, repair, or other activity does not entail unmitigated disturbance of any soil or is covered by Act of God provisions of the Planning Code; and
- (b) projects and related activities undertaken to minimize damage or potential damage associated with the Edgehill Way slide; and
- (c) projects and related activities undertaken to protect persons or property, to stabilize slopes, and/or to minimize soil erosion, surface runoff, or other factors that may negatively impact soil stability in the Edgehill Mountain Slope Protection Area; and,
 - (d) projects undertaken directly by the City and County of San Francisco; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, As required by Planning Code Section 306.7(b), that the provisions of this resolution shall not apply to applications filed more than 60 days before the first noticed hearing on the proposed interim controls for the Edgehill Mountain Slope Protection Area, in File Number 990218, and shall not prohibit action on applications which would otherwise be deemed approved during the period of such suspension pursuant to California Government Code Sections 65950 – 65957.1; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That this resolution advances and is consistent with the priority policies of Planning Code Section 101.1 in that it will conserve existing housing and neighborhood character and have no adverse impact on existing neighborhood-serving retail uses, affordable housing, commuter traffic, the City's diverse economic base, earthquake preparedness, landmarks and historic buildings, or parks and open space; and be it

FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Clerk of the Board is requested to transmit a copy of this order to the Zoning Administrator, the Director of the Department of Building Inspection, the Board of Appeals, and other permit-issuing and permit-approving agencies of the City.
