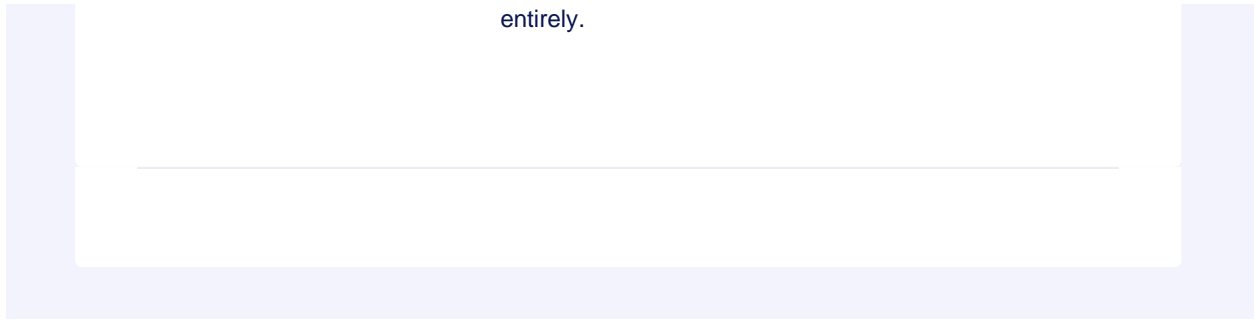

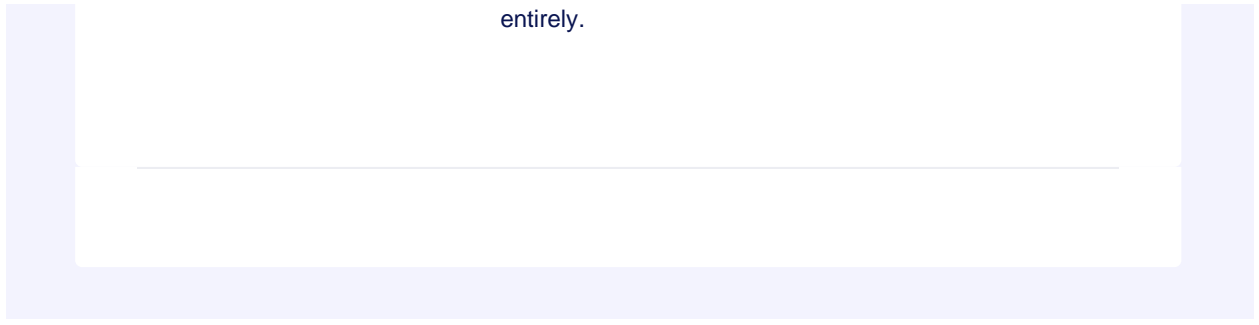

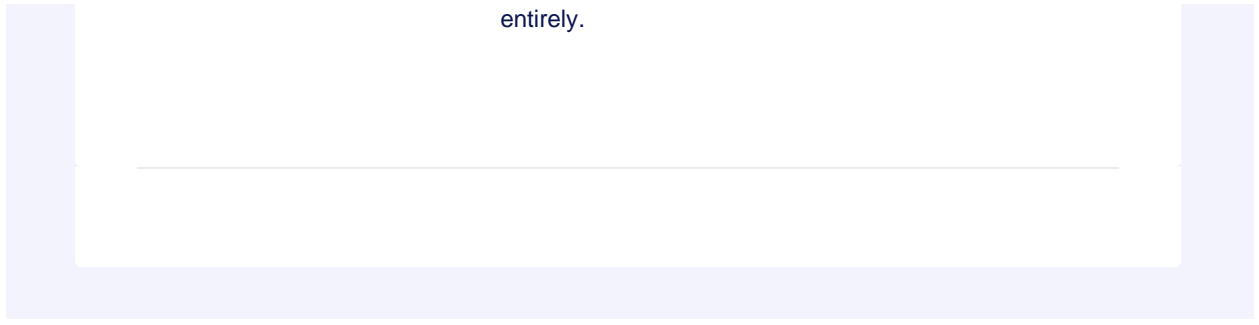

The net amount needed to fund the ORIGINAL Dorsey Charter amendment is estimated to be \$20M annually (after accounting for overtime savings).

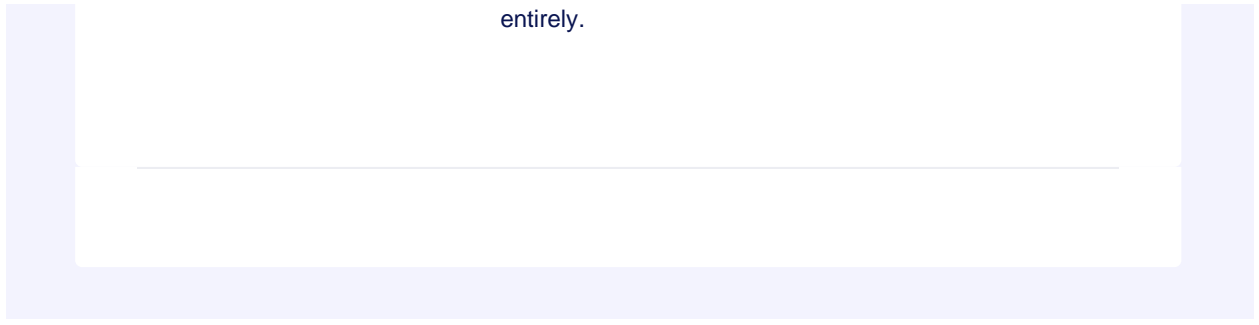
