10 Be it ordained by the People of the City and County of San Francisco:

11 Section 1. Environmental Findings.

12 The Planning Department has determined that the actions contemplated in this
13 Ordinance comply with the California Environmental Quality Act (California Public Resources
14 Code Section 21000 et seq.). Said determination is on file with the Clerk of the Board of
15 Supervisors in File No. 130547 and is incorporated herein by reference.

16 Section 2. The Health Code is hereby amended by amending
17 Section 128, to read as follows:

18 **SEC. 128. PATIENT RATES.** (a) The Board of Supervisors of the City and County of
19 San Francisco does hereby determine and fix the proper reasonable amounts to be charged
20 to persons for services furnished by the Department of Public Health as follows, which rates
21 shall be effective for services delivered as of ~~July 1, 2012~~ July 1, 2013 through June 30, 2015.

Ordinance amending the Health Code to set patient rates and other services provided by the Department of Public Health, effective July 1, 2013; and making environmental findings.

Existing Law

The Board of Supervisors of the City and County of San Francisco determines the reasonable amounts to be charged to persons for services furnished by the Department of Public Health. These rates are set forth in Section 128 of the San Francisco Health Code.

Amendments to Current Law

The Ordinance amends Section 128 of the San Francisco Health Code to set patient rates and other services provided by the Department of Public Health, effective July 1, 2013.
